ABOUT DOANE COLLEGE

When Thomas Doane, chief civil engineer of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, began building the railroad across Nebraska in the late 1800s, his goal was not only to enhance civilized life for the pioneers, but also to build a liberal arts college on the Nebraska frontier. He and the Congregationalists soon chose the town of Crete, overlooking the Big Blue River, for a college on the plains. The college maintains historical ties with the United Church of Christ.

Thomas Doane's vision of a college in the tradition of Harvard and Yale has become a reality. Fully established in 1872, Doane is Nebraska's first private liberal arts and sciences college.

From the college's formative years under the tutelage of first president David Brainerd Perry to the current 11th president, Jonathan Brand, the college continues its purpose to educate students to serve and lead in the state, the nation and the world.

Today, the college serves more than 3,200 students in bachelor's and master's degree programs in Crete, Lincoln, and Grand Island, Neb., and focuses on providing an exceptional educational experience for all students.

Doane College is one of only two schools in Nebraska to be ranked among the top 25 institutions in the Midwest and as one of the Midwest's "best values" in the 2007 U.S. News & World Report College Guide.

The Crete campus serves approximately 1,000 residential students on 300 scenic acres. Designated a state arboretum, the once treeless landscape now boasts more than 100 varieties of trees, numerous plantings, ponds, and swans.

Doane College focuses on providing a student-centered, innovative environment for students and employees. Forty-plus major fields of study are offered, as well as pre-professional programs. More than 80 co-curricular activities and organizations are also available. From national championship athletic programs to music, theatre, and service clubs, students pursue many varied interests outside the classroom.

Leadership development underscores the students' experience in all aspects of the college. Doane's unique Hansen Leadership Program works with students to help enhance their leadership skills and talents, through speakers

and events, alumni mentors, course offerings, community service, and other activities.

Additional highlights include the four-year graduation guarantee for students...graduate within four years or the college will pay for a fifth year of course work. A travel scholarship for students provides opportunities to travel on college-sponsored trips in the U.S. or abroad. Doane College was the first institution in the nation to initiate a warranty for its education graduates to hiring school districts, and guarantees teacher education graduates a position.

Doane College also offers three graduate degree programs, including the Master of Arts in Management (MAM), Master of Arts in Counseling (MAC), and Master of Education (MED) in Curriculum and Instruction or Educational Leadership.

Stephanie Kindt became the Tigers' Head Athletic Trainer in 1997. She is a 1991 graduate of North Dakota State University, Fargo, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training. She has a Master's degree from the University of Florida, Gainesville, in Exercise and Sports Sciences. Kindt is a Certified Athletic Trainer through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). She is also an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.



Brad Jenny joined the Tiger athletic training staff in 1999 as assistant Athletic Trainer. He is a 1993 graduate of Doane College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with an Athletic Training emphasis. He has a Master's degree in HPER (health, physical education and recreation) from Northern State University in Aberdeen, S.D., where he served as a graduate assistant Athletic Trainer for one year. Brad is certified through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and also holds a CSCS through the NSCA.

The Doane College Sports Information Office is always interested in helping members of the media in their coverage of Tiger Athletics. The contact for all athletic events is Rick Schmuecker. Athlete features and interviews, credential request, photographs and statistics are available through the sports information office.

Schmuecker joined the Tiger team in August 2001 as assistant sports information director, following four years as a student at Midland Lutheran College. During his time at MLC working under Keith Kramme, Schmuecker gained valuable experience that has allowed him to improve Doane's media connections.

ABOUT THE GPAC

The Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) is an affiliated conference of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), consisting of 13 private, faith-based colleges and universities in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota. Originally founded in 1969 as the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NIAC), the league retains all six of its charter members – Concordia, Dana, Doane, Hastings, Midland Lutheran and Nebraska Wesleyan.

In 1992, the NIAC added Northwestern and became the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference. Eight years later, Dakota Wesleyan, Dordt, Mount Marty and Sioux Falls joined the conference which became the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) in 2000-2001.

Briar Cliff entered the league in 2002-2003 and Morningside became the 13th member starting with the 2003-2004 school year. Both schools are in Sioux City, Iowa.

The GPAC sponsors 19 intercollegiate sports - nine for women and ten for men - and awards an All-Sports Trophy based on the final league standings and conference meet results at the end of each school year. Wrestling has added as a sanctioned GPAC sport for 2006-2007. The GPAC is the only NAIA conference in the country to sponsor wrestling.

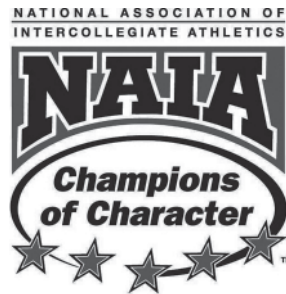
In 2000-2001 the Northwestern women and men won NAIA Division II National Basketball Championships, while the Doane women shared the outdoor NAIA Track and Field title. 2001-2002 brought two NAIA titles to our league. The Hastings women won the NAIA Division II National Basketball title, while Doane's women won the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship outright. In 2002-2003 the GPAC won two more National Championships with the Hastings women repeating as NAIA Division II National Basketball Champions, and the Northwestern men winning the NAIA Division II crown for the second time in three years. The Morningside women's basketball teams won the 2004 and 2005 titles in front of the hometown Sioux City fans at the Tyson Events Center. In 2006 the Hastings women's basketball team won their third basketball title in five years. The GPAC won six straight NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championships from 2001 to 2006. Also, in 2006 Dana College claimed the NAIA National Wrestling Championship. Our most recent NAIA title came this past fall when Sioux Falls won the 2006 Football Championship in Savannah, Tennessee. The GPAC has many individual NAIA National Champions in track and field.

During the 2006-07 academic year, the GPAC combined for 401 NAIA Scholar-Athletes, almost 100 more than the previous year.

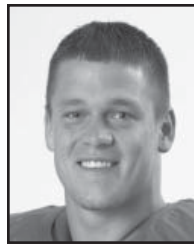


2006 GPAC STANDINGS

DOANE FOOTBALL HISTORY

The Doane College football program got its start in 1891 when they hosted the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in Crete. Doane lost the game 18-0. The Tigers first win came against the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, 28-4. The first winning season in the college's history was in 1894 when the team went 5-2. Football at Doane took a tragic hit in 1896 with the death of Bert Serf during a game against the University of Kansas. It wasn't until 1899 that football was reinstated at Doane. The only other time football was not played at the college was in from 1917-18 due to World War I.

Doane found success from 1925-30 under the direction of Ward Haylett and Roy Pierce. During those five years, the Tigers compiled a record of 26-9.

However, the greatest success in Doane football history occurred from 1966-69 when the Tigers went 33-0-2. Doane's success was not rewarded as they only received one invitation for post-season play. In 1968, the Tigers played Central Missouri State in the Mineral Water Bowl. Doane came away victorious, 10-0. Their undefeated streak received national recognition by *Sports Illustrated*, which did a two-page story on the program in the issue printed for October 13, 1969.

The first playoff appearance in Doane history came in 1972. Doane went 10-0 during the regular season and faced off against Missouri Southern University in the semifinals of the NAIA Playoffs. MSU defeated the Tigers 24-6.

From 1973-92, Doane posted a .543 winning percentage. They posted seven wins twice during that time. In 1993, the Tigers went 9-0 during the regular season and advanced to the NAIA Playoffs for the first time since 1972. Doane picked up their first playoff victory by defeating Bethany College 17-10. Baker University ended the season for Doane in the next round with a 28-21 win.

In 1997, Doane returned to the playoffs, this time poised for a championship run. The Tigers ran through Southwest Kansas University and Evangel University in the first two rounds of the playoffs. The Tigers traveled to Findlay, Ohio, for a semifinal battle with Findlay College. Findlay knocked Doane off 26-25 and advanced to the championship.

Despite suffering two conference losses in 1999, Doane was selected for the playoffs and faced off against Azusa Pacific University. APU defeated Doane in the first round, 31-12.

Fran Schwenk led Doane to the three playoff appearances during the 1990s. He is the winningest coach in Tiger history with a 114-87-3 record. Al Papik, coach of the Tigers from 1955-71, went 80-52-9 during his tenure.

Doane's athletic conference has also expanded to 13 teams, up from six in the early '50s. The quality of competition is as strong as ever and as good as any in the nation.
