ABOUT DOANE COLLEGE

When Thomas Doane, chief civil engineer of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, began building the railroad across Nebraska in the late 1800s, his goal was not only to enhance civilized life for the pioneers, but also to build a liberal arts college on the Nebraska frontier. He and the Congregationalists soon chose the town of Crete, overlooking the Big Blue River, for a college on the plains. The college maintains historical ties with the United Church of Christ.

Thomas Doane's vision of a college in the tradition of Harvard and Yale has become a reality. Fully established in 1872, Doane is Nebraska's first private liberal arts and sciences college.

From the college's formative years under the tutelage of first president David Brainerd Perry to the current 11th president, Jonathan Brand, the college continues its purpose to educate students to serve and lead in the state, the nation and the world.

Today, the college serves more than 3,200 students in bachelor's and master's degree programs in Crete, Lincoln, and Grand Island, Neb., and focuses on providing an exceptional educational experience for all students.

Doane College is one of only two schools in Nebraska to be ranked among the top 25 institutions in the Midwest and as one of the Midwest's "best values" in the 2007 U.S. News & World Report College Guide.

The Crete campus serves approximately 1,000 residential students on 300 scenic acres. Designated a state arboretum, the once treeless landscape now boasts more than 100 varieties of trees, numerous plantings, ponds, and swans.

Doane College focuses on providing a student-centered, innovative environment for students and employees. Forty-plus major fields of study are offered, as well as pre-professional programs. More than 80 co-curricular activities and organizations are also available. From national championship athletic programs to music, theatre, and service clubs, students pursue many varied interests outside the classroom.

Leadership development underscores the students' experience in all aspects of the college. Doane's unique Hansen Leadership Program works with students to help enhance their leadership skills and talents, through speakers

and events, alumni mentors, course offerings, community service, and other activities.

Additional highlights include the four-year graduation guarantee for students...graduate within four years or the college will pay for a fifth year of course work. A travel scholarship for students provides opportunities to travel on college-sponsored trips in the U.S. or abroad. Doane College was the first institution in the nation to initiate a warranty for its education graduates to hiring school districts, and guarantees teacher education graduates a position.

Doane College also offers three graduate degree programs, including the Master of Arts in Management (MAM), Master of Arts in Counseling (MAC), and Master of Education (MED) in Curriculum and Instruction or Educational Leadership.

Stephanie Kindt became the Tigers' Head Athletic Trainer in 1997. She is a 1991 graduate of North Dakota State University, Fargo, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training. She has a Master's degree from the University of Florida, Gainesville, in Exercise and Sports Sciences. Kindt is a Certified Athletic Trainer through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). She is also an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.



Brad Jenny joined the Tiger athletic training staff in 1999 as assistant Athletic Trainer. He is a 1993 graduate of Doane College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with an Athletic Training emphasis. He has a Master's degree in HPER (health, physical education and recreation) from Northern State University in Aberdeen, S.D., where he served as a graduate assistant Athletic Trainer for one year. Brad is certified through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and also holds a CSCS through the NSCA.

DOANE MEDIA INFORMATION

The Doane College Sports Information Office is always interested in helping members of the media in their coverage of Tiger Athletics. The contact for all athletic events is Rick Schmuecker. Athlete features and interviews, credential request, photographs and statistics are available through the sports information office.

Schmuecker joined the Tiger team in August 2001 as assistant sports information director, following four years as a student at Midland Lutheran College. During his time at MLC working under Keith Kramme, Schmuecker gained valuable experience that has allowed him to improve Doane's media connections.

At Doane, Rick is seen at all athletic events, usually in the designated media areas. He has received publication honors by the NAIA-SIDA in football and in soccer as well as with the Doane athletic web site. In May 2006, he was named head of the sports information department by Athletic Director Greg Heier.

However, the work that is done could not be completely accomplished without several student workers who also help out with game days and office work. These students are responsible for helping with statistics, running game clocks and setup for games. Their time and commitment is greatly appreciated.

2007 OUTLOOK

The Tigers will begin the **Greg Jarosik** era this fall after the Doane graduate took over the reigns of the program in December 2006. Jarosik graduated in 2001 and was a member of the soccer program from 1997-2000. He will attempt to move the Tigers up in the conference standings after a 5-9-3 record a year ago, including a 3-6-3 mark in the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC). Doane is two-years removed of three consecutive 11-plus win seasons.

Jarosik will have plenty of senior leadership to help bring the Tigers back to prominence. Leading the way will be all-conference selection **Justin Feerhusen (Lincoln)**. Feerhusen posted four goals and three assists last year while earning NAIA Scholar-Athlete and CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District honors. **Niki Mynatt (Loveland, Colo.)** has started every game he has played in over the past two seasons. **Scott Whitlock (Cody, Wyo.)** joined Mynatt on the defensive end last year and started 14 games. Other seniors expected to contribute this year are **Eli Page-Goertz (Overland Park, Kan.)**,



Jeremy Pernicek (Schuyler), **Jose Rodriguez (Bullhead City, Ariz.)** and **Tyler Stensgaard (Schuyler)**.

Pernicek and Rodriguez played in 13 games each last year.

Though there are only four, the junior class is strong in talent.

Thomas Dutcher (Waukee, Iowa) has played in 36 games the last two years at midfield. **Chris Hedgecock (North Platte)**, the team's leading scorer in 2006,

played in 17 games last year and scored five goals. **Jeffrey Wick (Fort Collins, Colo.)** has played in 33 games over the last two years as a forward/midfielder and has three goals over that time. **Jason Green (Simi Valley, Calif.)** will contend for the goaltender position after the graduation of Kyle Fritz.

The sophomore class is also at four. **Aaron Ideus (Lawrence, Kan.)** has the most experience, playing in 15 games last year and scoring a goal. **Chris Kavinsky (Englewood, Colo.)** will contend for the goalkeeper position after serving as a back up last year, playing one game in net. **Joseph Koziol (Lincoln)** saw six games in the midfield. **Jose Mejia (Columbus)** will also contend for varsity playing time as a forward or midfielder.

Jarosik also added 14 incoming recruits that will contend for playing time.

Schedule

2007 OUTLOOK/ROSTER

The schedule will not be easy but the Tigers have the opportunity to start the season with a couple of wins on their trip to California. The season opener is against San Diego Christian, who went 1-16 a year ago. Southwestern College (Ariz.) is the second opponent for the Tigers and they are in their first year as an intercollegiate team. The first home game is against Bethany College who went 0-12 last year.

McPherson College will provide Doane with their toughest test during the early non-conference schedule. The Bulldogs were 11-7-1 last year. The remaining non-conference game will be against NCAA Division II University of Mary.

Highlighting the home slate will be a September 25 match-up with defending conference champion Hastings College. Four of the six teams that qualified from the conference for the regional tournament last year will visit Crete this year.

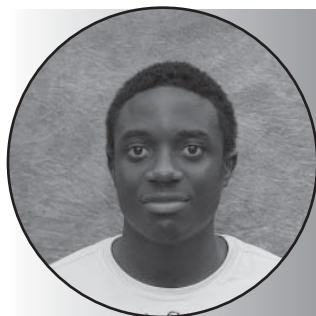

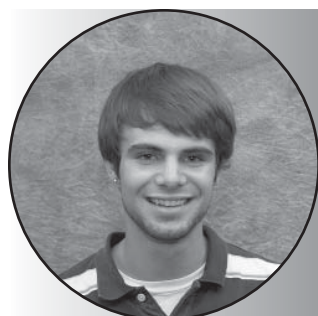

ABOUT THE GPAC

The Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) is an affiliated conference of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), consisting of 13 private, faith-based colleges and universities in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota. Originally founded in 1969 as the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NIAC), the league retains all six of its charter members – Concordia, Dana, Doane, Hastings, Midland Lutheran and Nebraska Wesleyan.

In 1992, the NIAC added Northwestern and became the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference. Eight years later, Dakota Wesleyan, Dordt, Mount Marty and Sioux Falls joined the conference which became the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) in 2000-2001.

Briar Cliff entered the league in 2002-2003 and Morningside became the 13th member starting with the 2003-2004 school year. Both schools are in Sioux City, Iowa.

The GPAC sponsors 19 intercollegiate sports - nine for women and ten for men - and awards an All-Sports Trophy based on the final league standings and conference meet results at the end of each school year. Wrestling has added as a sanctioned GPAC sport for 2006-2007. The GPAC is the only NAIA conference in the country to sponsor wrestling.

In 2000-2001 the Northwestern women and men won NAIA Division II National Basketball Championships, while the Doane women shared the outdoor NAIA Track and Field title. 2001-2002 brought two NAIA titles to our league. The Hastings women won the NAIA Division II National Basketball title, while Doane's women won the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship outright. In 2002-2003 the GPAC won two more National Championships with the Hastings women repeating as NAIA Division II National Basketball Champions, and the Northwestern men winning the NAIA Division II crown for the second time in three years. The Morningside women's basketball teams won the 2004 and 2005 titles in front of the hometown Sioux City fans at the Tyson Events Center. In 2006 the Hastings women's basketball team won their third basketball title in five years. The GPAC has now won six straight NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championships. Also, in 2006 Dana College claimed the NAIA National Wrestling Championship. Our most recent NAIA title came this past fall when Sioux Falls won the 2006 Football Championship in Savannah, Tennessee. The GPAC has many individual NAIA National Champions in track and field.

During the 2006-07 academic year, the GPAC combined for 401 NAIA Scholar-Athletes, almost 100 more than the previous year.

2006 YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2006 Doane men's soccer team fought through a roller coaster season and finished the year with a 5-9-3 record overall and 3-6-3 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) play. Lack of scoring offense hurt the Tigers as they were shutout seven times and lost six games by two goals or less. Defensively the Tigers were solid, allowing three or more goals only four times.

The season was not without highlights as there were many accolades throughout the season. Below is a look back at many of the accomplishments that occurred during the 2006 season for the Tigers.

Four Named All-GPAC

Doane placed four on the 2006 All-GPAC team. Seniors Andy Brabec, Kyle Fritz and Cory Stickney were joined by junior Justin Feerhusen on the honorable mention list.

Brabec posted two goals and three assists from the midfield position. Fritz collected 156 saves and a 1.67 goals against average (GAA). Stickney started all 17 games on the defensive end for the Tigers. Feerhusen notched four goals and three assists from his midfield position.



All-Nebraska Team Honored

The Omaha World Herald names an All-Nebraska team annually which consists of athletes from NCAA Division II schools to NAIA schools in Nebraska. Four men received honorable mention this year: Andy Brabec, Kyle Fritz, Cory Stickney and Justin Feerhusen.

2006 YEAR IN REVIEW

Feerhusen Earns Academic Awards

Justin Feerhusen not only achieved honors on the field but as well as in the class room. He was honored as a scholar-athlete by the NAIA. To receive the NAIA honor, a student-athlete must be of at least junior academic status and hold a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.50. Feerhusen holds a 4.0 GPA.

He was also named Second Team Academic All-District 7 by CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine. He was the first student-athlete to receive recognition for this honor.



Hedgecock Leads Doane Scorers

Sophomore Chris Hedgecock led the Tigers in scoring offense with five goals and two assists for 12 points in 2006. Justin Feerhusen, a junior, was second with four goals and three assists. Senior Justin Mynatt posted three goals, including two in a 3-1 victory over Mount Marty College

Jarosik Named Head Coach

In December 2006, Greg Jarosik was named the fourth head coach in Tiger soccer history. Jarosik was a member of the soccer program from 1997-2000. A May 2001 graduate, Jarosik has been coaching at Papillion-LaVista South High School since 2004. He has also been the head coach at Gretna High School and for the Arsenal Veleno club team.

DOANE MEN'S SOCCER HISTORY

Doane men's soccer began as an intercollegiate sport in the fall of 1996. The Tigers went 0-13 in that first year under coach Marty Shield. Shield coached the first six seasons of Tiger soccer, winning as many as 12 in 2000. The most wins in a season was in 2002 when Doane went 15-7-1.



Doane is one of a few schools that has two playing surfaces. The Den is a natural grass surface located on the east end of campus while Simon Field (pictured above) is an artificial turf surface that is also used for football and located on the northeast end of campus.

The Tigers have also had some excellent players come through the ranks during the brief existence. Eric Stearns and Rob Triano top the all-time goals scored list with 35. Wilson Herrera is second with 30 goals. Adam Boilesen holds the career assists mark with 26. Stearns is second with 22 career assists.



Kip Hovie holds the career mark for career wins with 35. He also holds the mark for career shutouts with 19. Chris Entwistle has the most saves in a career with 530. Greg Tuma holds the mark for most saves in a season with 198.

During the late 1950s, three men got together and formed the Doane Athletic Club (DAC). Al Papik (former athletic director), joined by Crete businessmen Tom Aron and Ben McDowell, Sr., laid the foundation for the scholarship club that has helped attract athletes to Doane over the past 50 years.

The club was formed with a promise to help attract talented athletes by awarding them scholarship money above and separate from the financial aid packages given to them by Doane College. At that time, there were only three major sports in need of DAC assistance: football, basketball and track. With the addition of women's athletics in 1972 and several other sports, the DAC now supports 18 men's and women's sports.

Doane's athletic conference has also expanded to 13 teams, up from six in the early '50s. The quality of competition is as strong as ever and as good as any in the nation.
