ABOUT DOANE COLLEGE

When Thomas Doane, chief civil engineer of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, began building the railroad across Nebraska in the late 1800s, his goal was not only to enhance civilized life for the pioneers, but also to build a liberal arts college on the Nebraska frontier. He and the Congregationalists soon chose the town of Crete, overlooking the Big Blue River, for a college on the plains. The college maintains historical ties with the United Church of Christ.

Thomas Doane's vision of a college in the tradition of Harvard and Yale has become a reality. Fully established in 1872, Doane is Nebraska's first private liberal arts and sciences college.

From the college's formative years under the tutelage of first president David Brainerd Perry to the current 11th president, Jonathan Brand, the college continues its purpose to educate students to serve and lead in the state, the nation and the world.

Today, the college serves more than 3,200 students in bachelor's and master's degree programs in Crete, Lincoln, and Grand Island, Neb., and focuses on providing an exceptional educational experience for all students.

Doane College is one of only two schools in Nebraska to be ranked among the top 25 institutions in the Midwest and as one of the Midwest's "best values" in the 2007 U.S. News & World Report College Guide.

The Crete campus serves approximately 1,000 residential students on 300 scenic acres. Designated a state arboretum, the once treeless landscape now boasts more than 100 varieties of trees, numerous plantings, ponds, and swans.

Doane College focuses on providing a student-centered, innovative environment for students and employees. Forty-plus major fields of study are offered, as well as pre-professional programs. More than 80 co-curricular activities and organizations are also available. From national championship athletic programs to music, theatre, and service clubs, students pursue many varied interests outside the classroom.

Leadership development underscores the students' experience in all aspects of the college. Doane's unique Hansen Leadership Program works with students to help enhance their leadership skills and talents, through speakers

and events, alumni mentors, course offerings, community service, and other activities.

Additional highlights include the four-year graduation guarantee for students...graduate within four years or the college will pay for a fifth year of course work. A travel scholarship for students provides opportunities to travel on college-sponsored trips in the U.S. or abroad. Doane College was the first institution in the nation to initiate a warranty for its education graduates to hiring school districts, and guarantees teacher education graduates a position.

Doane College also offers three graduate degree programs, including the Master of Arts in Management (MAM), Master of Arts in Counseling (MAC), and Master of Education (MED) in Curriculum and Instruction or Educational Leadership.

Stephanie Kindt became the Tigers' Head Athletic Trainer in 1997. She is a 1991 graduate of North Dakota State University, Fargo, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training. She has a Master's degree from the University of Florida, Gainesville, in Exercise and Sports Sciences. Kindt is a Certified Athletic Trainer through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). She is also an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.



Brad Jenny joined the Tiger athletic training staff in 1999 as assistant Athletic Trainer. He is a 1993 graduate of Doane College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with an Athletic Training emphasis. He has a Master's degree in HPER (health, physical education and recreation) from Northern State University in Aberdeen, S.D., where he served as a graduate assistant Athletic Trainer for one year. Brad is certified through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and also holds a CSCS through the NSCA.

The Doane College Sports Information Office is always interested in helping members of the media in their coverage of Tiger Athletics. The contact for all athletic events is Rick Schmuecker. Athlete features and interviews, credential request, photographs and statistics are available through the sports information office.

Schmuecker joined the Tiger team in August 2001 as assistant sports information director, following four years as a student at Midland Lutheran College. During his time at MLC working under Keith Kramme, Schmuecker gained valuable experience that has allowed him to improve Doane's media connections.

At Doane, Rick is seen at all athletic events, usually in the designated media areas. He has received publication honors by the NAIA-SIDA in football and in soccer as well as with the Doane athletic web site. In May 2006, he was named head of the sports information department by Athletic Director Greg Heier.

2007 OUTLOOK

The Tigers begin their fourth consecutive year with a new head coach as Duane Johnson takes over the program. Johnson is familiar with the program as his daughter has been a member of the team the previous three seasons. The biggest challenge for him when he took over was in recruiting as the numbers for the program were low. Entering preseason camp, Johnson will have 20 players practicing.

Leading the way will be senior **Anna Farlow** (Carlsbad, Calif.). Farlow has been a starter since her freshman year and anchors the midfield position. **Linnie Johnson** (Lincoln) will also be a senior and join Farlow as a team captain. However, she will miss the season due to injury.

Junior **Kelly Spencer** (Bellvue, Colo.) is also a team captain and will join Farlow as a midfielder. Spencer tallied two goals last year and is a two-year starter. **Lindley Erhart** (Springfield) is also a two-year starter as a defender. She provides the most game experience in the young defensive unit.



The Tiger sophomores received plenty of playing experience a year ago. Leading the way was Second Team All-GPAC defender **Erin Keegan** (Omaha). **Alicia Exstrom** (Lincoln) was named All-Nebraska after a strong year in goal. **Kelsey Kovar** (Schuyler) was the team's leading scorer after posting five goals and two assists last year. **Emma Kucera** (Lincoln) started every game last year and collected two goals from the midfield position. **Jayne Wagner** (Fort Collins, Colo.) started 15 games as a defender, missing two due to injury. **Jaime Duggan** (Grand Island) collected an assist in 13 games as a forward and **Bridget Koehler** (Windsor, Colo.) saw action in five games as a defender.

Nine new recruits will also be counted on early to step in and provide support.

2007 OUTLOOK/ROSTER

Doane will look to build on last year's defensive effort, were they allowed nearly two goals less per game than in 2005. However, the offensive output will need to improve as the Tigers were limited to 15 goals a year ago and shutout 12 times.

Schedule

The schedule will not be easy for the Tigers as the conference continues to get stronger. The non-conference slate features Wayne State College, an NCAA Division II program, and Point Loma Nazarene, an NAIA National Tournament qualifier who finished 2006 ranked No. 7. The first home match of the season will take place on September 4 against Northwest Oklahoma State in a mid-week afternoon contest.

Head Coach Duane Johnson took over the Tiger women's soccer program in December 2006. He is also the head coach for Lincoln Southeast High School and led the team to the 2007 NSAA State Tournament.

Johnson is very familiar to Doane College and Tiger soccer. His son, Cory, graduated from Doane in 2005 and was a member of the men's soccer team. His daughter, Linnie, is a member of the women's team and will graduate in 2008.

He got his start in coaching in 1988 when he began working with Lincoln area youths. In 1997-98, Johnson was named Coach-of-the-Year by the Nebraska State Soccer Association (NSSA). From 1998-2002 he was Director of Coaching for the Lincoln Spirit Soccer Club. ABOUT THE GPAC

The Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) is an affiliated conference of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), consisting of 13 private, faith-based colleges and universities in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota. Originally founded in 1969 as the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NIAC), the league retains all six of its charter members – Concordia, Dana, Doane, Hastings, Midland Lutheran and Nebraska Wesleyan.

In 1992, the NIAC added Northwestern and became the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference. Eight years later, Dakota Wesleyan, Dordt, Mount Marty and Sioux Falls joined the conference which became the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) in 2000-2001.

Briar Cliff entered the league in 2002-2003 and Morningside became the 13th member starting with the 2003-2004 school year. Both schools are in Sioux City, Iowa.

The GPAC sponsors 19 intercollegiate sports - nine for women and ten for men - and awards an All-Sports Trophy based on the final league standings and conference meet results at the end of each school year. Wrestling has added as a sanctioned GPAC sport for 2006-2007. The GPAC is the only NAIA conference in the country to sponsor wrestling.

In 2000-2001 the Northwestern women and men won NAIA Division II National Basketball Championships, while the Doane women shared the outdoor NAIA Track and Field title. 2001-2002 brought two NAIA titles to our league. The Hastings women won the NAIA Division II National Basketball title, while Doane's women won the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship outright. In 2002-2003 the GPAC won two more National Championships with the Hastings women repeating as NAIA Division II National Basketball Champions, and the Northwestern men winning the NAIA Division II crown for the second time in three years. The Morningside women's basketball teams won the 2004 and 2005 titles in front of the hometown Sioux City fans at the Tyson Events Center. In 2006 the Hastings women's basketball team won their third basketball title in five years. The GPAC has now won six straight NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championships. Also, in 2006 Dana College claimed the NAIA National Wrestling Championship. Our most recent NAIA title came this past fall when Sioux Falls won the 2006 Football Championship in Savannah, Tennessee. The GPAC has many individual NAIA National Champions in track and field.

During the 2006-07 academic year, the GPAC combined for 401 NAIA Scholar-Athletes, almost 100 more than the previous year.

2006 YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2006 Doane women's soccer team battled through transition before and during the season and struggled to a 3-13-1 record overall and 3-8-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) play. The Tiger's system was more defensive oriented which was evident in both offensive goals scored and goals allowed. Doane only scored 15 goals on the season with 10 coming in one game. They were shutout 12 times, starting with the first five games and ending with the last six. The goals allowed average did decrease from the previous year by nearly two goals, from 4.06 per game in 2005 to 2.38 in 2006.

The season was not without highlights as there were accolades and accomplishments garnered during the season. Below is a look back at the 2006 campaign.



Two Named All-GPAC

Doane placed two on the 2006 All-GPAC team, led by freshman Erin Keegan, who was voted to by the conference coaches to the Second Team. Senior Janelle Belina was named to the honorable mention list. The two defensive players played key roles in the Tigers improved defense. Keegan started 16 of 17 games while Belina started all 16 games she played in and also notched two assists.

Omaha World Herald All-Nebraska Team

The Omaha World Herald names an annual All-Nebraska team that is comprised of all the NAIA Nebraska schools. This past season Erin Keegan and Alicia Exstrom were named honorable mention for the Tigers.

Kovar Tallies Hat-Trick

The Tigers entered their 10th game of the season having scored three goals in the previous nine matches. On September 30 versus Mount Marty College, Kelsey Kovar doubled the scoring output herself as she scored three of Doane's 10 goals in the game. She also added an assists.



2006 YEAR IN REVIEW

Kovar was Doane's leading score on the season, collecting six goals. She had the game-winning goal versus Briar Cliff University (1-0) and against Dana College (2-0). Kover posted both goals in the win over the Vikings.

Exstrom Posts Back-to-Back Shutouts

Alicia Exstrom benefited from a scoring out-burst as the Tigers scored 12 goals in two games but she also took care of business as she held Mount Marty College and Dana College scoreless. Mount Marty was only able to put two shots on goal but Dana had several chances and Exstrom collected 10 saves.

She also posted a shutout victory over Briar Cliff University for her first collegiate shutout. Her three shutouts already moves her into the Top 5 in Doane's 11 year history.



Johnson Named New Coach

In December 2006, Doane named Duane Johnson the head coach of the women's program. Johnson is very familiar with Tiger soccer as his daughter, Linnie, is a member of the team. His son, Cory, played four years for the men's program. Johnson has had much recent success in the high school ranks, leading Lincoln Southeast to the state tournament in the spring of 2007.

DOANE WOMEN'S SOCCER HISTORY

Doane women's soccer began as an intercollegiate sport in the fall of 1996. The Tigers went 7-7 in that first year under coach Eliot Siegman. Siegman went on to coach Doane for eight of the first nine years and was named the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference (NIAC) Coach-of-the-Year in 1997 when they posted a school-best record 13-6-1. In Siegman's last year as coach at Doane, the Tigers tied the school record for wins in a season when they went 13-7-2.



Doane is one of a few schools that has two playing surfaces. The Den is a natural grass surface located on the east end of campus while Simon Field (pictured above) is an artificial turf surface that is also used for football and located on the northeast end of campus.

The Tigers have also had some excellent players come through the ranks during the brief existence. Jeni Swanson was the first Tiger to earn conference player-of-the-year honors after she posted 29 goals and 12 assists in 1999. Stacy Vendetti followed Swanson honor a year later in 2000, the first year of the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC), by posting 20 goals. Amanda Creighton earned the conference honor in 2002 as she posted 21 goals and nine assists on her way to becoming a Second Team NAIA All-American.



One of the most underrated Tigers was goalkeeper Shannon Sullivan. Sullivan was a four-year starter and graduated with nine of 11 school records. She earned honorable mention All-American honors in her final season (2004) while posting nine shutouts and 13 wins. She is the all-time wins leader with 37, saves leader with 652, and is second in goals against average with 2.27 per game.

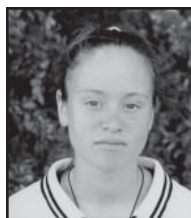

During the late 1950s, three men got together and formed the Doane Athletic Club (DAC). Al Papik (former athletic director), joined by Crete businessmen Tom Aron and Ben McDowell, Sr., laid the foundation for the scholarship club that has helped attract athletes to Doane over the past 50 years.

The club was formed with a promise to help attract talented athletes by awarding them scholarship money above and separate from the financial aid packages given to them by Doane College. At that time, there were only three major sports in need of DAC assistance: football, basketball and track. With the addition of women's athletics in 1972 and several other sports, the DAC now supports 18 men's and women's sports.

Doane's athletic conference has also expanded to 13 teams, up from six in the early '50s. The quality of competition is as strong as ever and as good as any in the nation.
