ABOUT DOANE COLLEGE

When Thomas Doane, chief civil engineer of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, began building the railroad across Nebraska in the late 1800s, his goal was not only to enhance civilized life for the pioneers, but also to build a liberal arts college on the Nebraska frontier. He and the Congregationalists soon chose the town of Crete, overlooking the Big Blue River, for a college on the plains. The college maintains historical ties with the United Church of Christ.

Thomas Doane's vision of a college in the tradition of Harvard and Yale has become a reality. Fully established in 1872, Doane is Nebraska's first private liberal arts and sciences college.

From the college's formative years under the tutelage of first president David Brainerd Perry to the current 11th president, Jonathan Brand, the college continues its purpose to educate students to serve and lead in the state, the nation and the world.

Today, the college serves more than 3,200 students in bachelor's and master's degree programs in Crete, Lincoln, and Grand Island, Neb., and focuses on providing an exceptional educational experience for all students.

Doane College is one of only two schools in Nebraska to be ranked among the top 25 institutions in the Midwest and as one of the Midwest's "best values" in the 2007 U.S. News & World Report College Guide.

The Crete campus serves approximately 1,000 residential students on 300 scenic acres. Designated a state arboretum, the once treeless landscape now boasts more than 100 varieties of trees, numerous plantings, ponds, and swans.

Doane College focuses on providing a student-centered, innovative environment for students and employees. Forty-plus major fields of study are offered, as well as pre-professional programs. More than 80 co-curricular activities and organizations are also available. From national championship athletic programs to music, theatre, and service clubs, students pursue many varied interests outside the classroom.

Leadership development underscores the students' experience in all aspects of the college. Doane's unique Hansen Leadership Program works with students to help enhance their leadership skills and talents, through speakers

and events, alumni mentors, course offerings, community service, and other activities.

Additional highlights include the four-year graduation guarantee for students...graduate within four years or the college will pay for a fifth year of course work. A travel scholarship for students provides opportunities to travel on college-sponsored trips in the U.S. or abroad. Doane College was the first institution in the nation to initiate a warranty for its education graduates to hiring school districts, and guarantees teacher education graduates a position.

Doane College also offers three graduate degree programs, including the Master of Arts in Management (MAM), Master of Arts in Counseling (MAC), and Master of Education (MED) in Curriculum and Instruction or Educational Leadership.

Stephanie Kindt became the Tigers' Head Athletic Trainer in 1997. She is a 1991 graduate of North Dakota State University, Fargo, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training. She has a Master's degree from the University of Florida, Gainesville, in Exercise and Sports Sciences. Kindt is a Certified Athletic Trainer through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). She is also an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.



Brad Jenny joined the Tiger athletic training staff in 1999 as assistant Athletic Trainer. He is a 1993 graduate of Doane College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with an Athletic Training emphasis. He has a Master's degree in HPER (health, physical education and recreation) from Northern State University in Aberdeen, S.D., where he served as a graduate assistant Athletic Trainer for one year. Brad is certified through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and also holds a CSCS through the NSCA.

The Doane College Sports Information Office is always interested in helping members of the media in their coverage of Tiger Athletics. The contact for all athletic events is Rick Schmuecker. Athlete features and interviews, credential request, photographs and statistics are available through the sports information office.

Schmuecker joined the Tiger team in August 2001 as assistant sports information director, following four years as a student at Midland Lutheran College. During his time at MLC working under Keith Kramme, Schmuecker gained valuable experience that has allowed him to improve Doane's media connections.

At Doane, Rick is seen at all athletic events, usually in the designated media areas. He has received publication honors by the NAIA-SIDA in football and in soccer as well as with the Doane athletic web site. In May 2006, he was named head of the sports information department by Athletic Director Greg Heier.

These students are responsible for helping with statistics, running game clocks and setup for games. Their time and commitment is greatly appreciated.

Tiger Sports Network



In Fall 2007, the Tiger Sports Network was launched with the intent to bring more broadcasts to the Doane family. Doane has joined with Stretch Internet to bring forth the best broadcasts available. Thayer is in his final year as a student at Doane but has been calling the Tiger action since his first year on campus. 2007 OUTLOOK

Doane will seek another 20 win season this year but must replace two four-year starters. Head Coach Cindy Meyer enters her 21st season after the Tigers posted a 26-9 overall record and advanced to the regional tournament a year ago.

Meyer's Tigers will rely on two middle hitters, **Kari Hochstein** and **Chelsee Marvin**, to anchor the attack. Hochstein, a senior from Wayne, led the Tigers in kills and blocks a season ago while Marvin, a junior from Crete, was third in kills and second in blocks.

On the left-side attack, the Tigers have many options but early on three sophomores could see plenty of time. **Jessy Livers** (Lincoln), **Ivie Speer** (Central City) and **Abby Scott** (Belgrade) are expected to see a lot of rotations.



The right-side attack will feature senior **Caitlin Schaffert** (Indianola) and sophomore **Michelle Ortmeier** (Utica). The two will compete for playing time with Speer and Scott, who are also expected to see some time at the position. The Doane offensive system will decide how many repetitions are taken by the abundance of hitters.

To determine the offensive system, Coach Meyer will need to determine if she has two setters ready to handle the duties of a 6-2 offense. Several setters return, including back-up **Ashley Sluka**, a junior from Milligan. Sluka has played primarily as a defensive specialist in varsity games her first two seasons. It's possible that the Tigers will play a 5-1 or 6-2 offense in the same match depending on situations.

Defense has been the name of the game for the Tigers for several years. **Kaylee Lubken** (Trumbull) returns for her second season as the Doane libero. **Emily Schwisow** (Beatrice) saw action late in the season as a defensive specialist. One area the Tigers hope to improve on this year is blocking, which will be key with the tough schedule that faces the Doane spikers.

The Schedule

Doane will face one of the toughest schedules in recent years. Coach Meyer's teams are known for playing strong non-conference opponents and this year will be no different. In the first two weekends of the season, Doane will face four participants in last year's NAIA National Tournament. College of St. Mary advanced to the Elite Eight before bowing out of the tournament while Georgetown went 0-3 in pool play. The two teams will face the Tigers at the Red Raider Classic.

2007 OUTLOOK/ROSTER

Doane will travel to Irvine, California, and face two national semifinalists in Concordia University (CA) and California Baptist University over Labor Day weekend. The Tigers will take the following weekend off before travel to Hastings for the Bronco Invite where their first match will be against NAIA National Champion National American University. NAU finished last year with a 41-0 record. College of St. Mary will also be on the schedule for the second time of the year.

The Tigers first month will also feature a match-up with rival and tournament qualifier Hastings College in Hastings. The game marks one of two regular season matches but the two teams could play a few more, having hooked up in the postseason the last three years.

Doane will host perennial powers Dordt College on Sep. 29 and Northwestern College on Oct. 20. Northwestern qualified for the national tournament a year ago while Dordt advanced to the tournament two years ago with the Tigers.

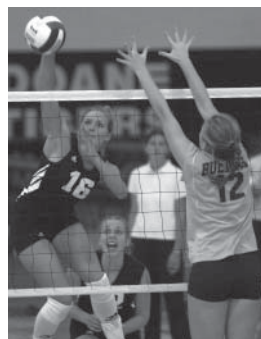

Head Coach Cindy Meyer began her collegiate coaching career at Doane College in 1987 with a victory over the College of St. Mary. Since that time, Meyer's teams have gone to five national tournaments (1990, '94, '97, 2002, '05) and several regional tournaments while her program emphasizes outstanding fundamentals and team cohesiveness. Meyer is the winningest coach in Tiger volleyball history and she has coached six conference players-of-the-year, 11 All-Americans, and 23 NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

In 2006, Meyer picked up her 500th victory as a collegiate coach with a 3-0 victory over Dakota Wesleyan University. On average, it has only taken her three to five years to reach 100 win plateau. She hit win 100 in 1990 with a victory over Washburn University. In 1993, a victory over Midland Lutheran College gave Meyer win 200. Wins 300 & 400 came against Hastings College in 1997 and 2002. Meyer is one of eight active coaches in the NAIA to reach 500 wins entering the 2007 season.

Meyer, associate professor of physical education, earned a bachelor's degree from Wayne State College and a master's degree from Kearney State College (UNK). She began her coaching career at Ainsworth High School, where she led her teams to an 83-30 overall record and four state tournament appearances. Meyer has also established one of the premier summer volleyball camps, drawing hundreds of young student-athletes each year.

ABOUT THE GPAC

The Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) is an affiliated conference of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), consisting of 13 private, faith-based colleges and universities in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota. Originally founded in 1969 as the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NIAC), the league retains all six of its charter members – Concordia, Dana, Doane, Hastings, Midland Lutheran and Nebraska Wesleyan.

In 1992, the NIAC added Northwestern and became the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference. Eight years later, Dakota Wesleyan, Dordt, Mount Marty and Sioux Falls joined the conference which became the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) in 2000-2001.

Briar Cliff entered the league in 2002-2003 and Morningside became the 13th member starting with the 2003-2004 school year. Both schools are in Sioux City, Iowa.

The GPAC sponsors 19 intercollegiate sports - nine for women and ten for men - and awards an All-Sports Trophy based on the final league standings and conference meet results at the end of each school year. Wrestling has added as a sanctioned GPAC sport for 2006-2007. The GPAC is the only NAIA conference in the country to sponsor wrestling.

In 2000-2001 the Northwestern women and men won NAIA Division II National Basketball Championships, while the Doane women shared the outdoor NAIA Track and Field title. 2001-2002 brought two NAIA titles to our league. The Hastings women won the NAIA Division II National Basketball title, while Doane's women won the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship outright. In 2002-2003 the GPAC won two more National Championships with the Hastings women repeating as NAIA Division II National Basketball Champions, and the Northwestern men winning the NAIA Division II crown for the second time in three years. The Morningside women's basketball teams won the 2004 and 2005 titles in front of the hometown Sioux City fans at the Tyson Events Center. In 2006 the Hastings women's basketball team won their third basketball title in five years. The GPAC won six straight NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championships from 2001 to 2006. Also, in 2006 Dana College claimed the NAIA National Wrestling Championship. Our most recent NAIA title came this past fall when Sioux Falls won the 2006 Football Championship in Savannah, Tennessee. The GPAC has many individual NAIA National Champions in track and field.

During the 2006-07 academic year, the GPAC combined for 401 NAIA Scholar-Athletes, almost 100 more than the previous year.

2006 YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2006 Doane volleyball team completed another successful season, finishing 26-9 overall and 12-4 in the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC). The Tigers continue to play some of the top opponents in the country, playing 11 matches against ranked teams. They finished the season ranked No. 6 in Region III and No. 23 in the NAIA. The season came to a close in the regional tournament as the Tigers fell to Hastings College in four games.

The season was not without highlights as there were many accolades throughout the season. Below is a look back at many of the accomplishments that occurred during the 2006 season for the Tigers.

Trio Earn NAIA Scholar-Athlete

Senior Allison Weaver and juniors Kaylee Lubken and Caitlin Schaffert were named to the 2006 NAIA Scholar-Athlete list. Doane finished the school year with 38 Scholar-Athletes honored for posting a cumulative grade point average of 3.50.

Only those student-athletes that have earned junior academic standing are eligible for the award. Under Head Coach Cindy Meyer, Doane has earned 23 accolades in 20 years.



Four Named All-GPAC

Doane placed four on the 2006 All-GPAC team, led by First Team members Rachel Hagerman and Kari Hochstein. Hagerman was the top setter in the GPAC during the year, proven as she was the only one to receive First Team accolades. Hochstein was once again one of the top middle blockers, a position that dominated seven of the 14 spots on the First Team.

Allison Weaver received Second Team honors from the outside hitter position. The position did not receive as much support in the conference vote by the coaches as only eight outside hitters were elected to the 24 spots on the First and Second Teams. Chelsea Marvin was named honorable mention at the middle blocker position.

Omaha World Herald Names All-Nebraska

The Omaha World Herald names an annual All-Nebraska team that is comprised of all NAIA Nebraska schools. This past season, Allison Weaver and Kari Hochstein were named to the First Team while Rachel Hagerman and Ashley Sluka received honorable mention.

MILESTONES ATTAINED IN '06

Hagerman Sets School Assists Record

Rachel Hagerman broke the career assists record on October 31 against Nebraska Wesleyan University as she surpassed Dayna Nyland's mark of 4,605. Hagerman finished with 4,813 career assists, an average of 10.28 assists per game. Combined with her performance against Concordia University later in the week, Hagerman was named the NAIA National Setter-of-the-Week. She was named the GPAC Setter-of-the-Week three times during the 2006 season and Region III Setter-of-the-Week twice.



Seniors Close Out Careers

Rachel Hagerman and Allison Weaver capped their careers with several individual accomplishments. Hagerman finished as the all-time leader in career assists (4,813) while finishing ninth in ace serves (161). Weaver finished second all-time in career digs (2,674) and eighth in kills (1,176). Over four years, the team never finished below third in the GPAC and was rated in the NAIA each season. They won 70 percent of the games they played in, finishing with a 102-43 record.

Meyer Reaches 500 Wins

Cindy Meyer reached the 500 win plateau with the Tigers' victory over Dakota Wesleyan University on October 6. Meyer has posted an impressive 507-258 mark during 20 seasons as the Tiger leader. During her time at Doane, the Tigers have advanced to the NAIA National Tournament five times, 10 athletes have been named NAIA All-Americans, six athletes have been named the conference player-of-the-year and 23 have earned NAIA Scholar-Athlete honors.

DOANE VOLLEYBALL HISTORY

Doane's volleyball history dates back to the early 1970s. According to newspaper reports, Doane's first year of women's athletics was 1972. Records and documents prior to 1987 are scarce, anyone with information that could help fill in this time gap please contact the Doane Sports Information Office.



In 1971, Doane volleyball was considered an intramural or club sport. It took a couple of years to build but Doane volleyball had reached national prominence by advancing to the NAIA National Tournament in 1985 while coached by Sandy Cottle.



Since then, Doane has been a consistent threat not only in the conference, but nationally as well. The program has averaged 26 wins per year and advanced to six NAIA National Tournaments, five times under current head coach Cindy Meyer.



During the past 22 years (1985-2006), eight women have earned 11 All-American team honors (first, second or third team). Lori Stueckrath (pictured left) earned All-American honors in 1987 and 1988, becoming the first Tiger to receive the award. Dayna Nyland and Andrea Gall also earned All-American honors in back-to-back years. Cindy Peterson joins Stueckrath with the honor of being the only Tigers to earn First Team All-American honors.

Doane has also had success in the classroom as 24 women have earned NAIA Scholar-Athlete honors. Nancy Sackett was the first to do so in 1985. Only twice has Doane had three recipients honored in the same year, 2002 and 2006.

During the late 1950s, three men got together and formed the Doane Athletic Club (DAC). Al Papik (former athletic director), joined by Crete businessmen Tom Aron and Ben McDowell, Sr., laid the foundation for the scholarship club that has helped attract athletes to Doane over the past 50 years.

The club was formed with a promise to help attract talented athletes by awarding them scholarship money above and separate from the financial aid packages given to them by Doane College. At that time, there were only three major sports in need of DAC assistance: football, basketball and track. With the addition of women's athletics in 1972 and several other sports, the DAC now supports 18 men's and women's sports.

Doane's athletic conference has also expanded to 13 teams, up from six in the early '50s. The quality of competition is as strong as ever and as good as any in the nation.
