### 103 Introduction to Fine Arts: Music (3)

An introduction to the art of music as an expression of the cultures of civilizations, both East and West, through selected examples of music literature.

### 104 Fundamentals of Music (3)

A study of the nature of musical intelligence, aptitude and sensitivity; basic rhythmic, pitch, and intervallic skills. This course also emphasizes the development of individual musical potential, as well as the understanding of music as an art form. **Required of all freshmen planning a music or music education major or minor and of students who receive a substantial music special ability scholarship. This course should be taken in the fall of the freshman year.**

## French (FRE)

The French program is designed to serve a variety of goals. It provides instruction in the French language, French and Francophone literature and culture, and plays an integral role in the Contemporary European Studies major. Students with a knowledge of French will find career opportunities throughout the French-speaking world in business, management, marketing, development programs, education, science, and communication. A major in French is required for certification to teach the language in high school.

### Requirements for the French Major:

1. Complete 30 credits of French, excluding French 101, 102, 319, 321, 324, and 325.
2. A student **must** earn 12 to 17 credits in French in an approved semester or summer abroad program. The student has the option of earning up to 24 credits for a full year abroad. (*Refer to Off-Campus Study Programs.*)
3. Students seeking certification for teaching French in the public schools must also complete:
  - a. French 319, 321, 324, 325.
  - b. One additional teaching major.
  - c. All requirements listed under the catalog section Secondary Education.

### Requirements for the French Minor:

Complete 18 credits of French, excluding French 101, 102, 319, 321, 324, and 325. Advanced students complete 12 credits of French beyond the intermediate level, excluding 319, 321, 324, 325.
