

325 Methods I (3)

An examination of current theory, methods and materials used for English as a Second Language instruction as well as a survey of assessment instruments and measurements appropriate for use with the English as a Second Language student to aid in the diagnosis and treatment of problems associated with learning English as a Second Language.

326 Methods II (3)

A survey of the methods of teaching English as a Second Language. Topics to be covered include materials, selection, objective writing, materials preparation, test construction, and classroom management.

421 Internship in Teaching English as a Second Language (3)

A field experience centering around teaching in an English as a Second Language classroom, with full responsibility to plan and teach classes for a period of four weeks.

455 Student Teaching (English as a Second Language) (10)

Full-time student teaching in the area of English as a Second Language with K-12 experiences. Students will carry out all responsibilities to plan and teach classes for the second language learner. *Prerequisite: English as a Second Language 211, 325, and 326, or permission. Offered fall term.*

Requirements for the Environmental Studies Major:

1. Biology 101, 206, 208, 252, 295, and 342.
2. Sixteen credits of chemistry.
3. Geology 103.
4. One course chosen from Mathematics 105, 125, or 235.
5. One three-credit 300-400 level course in economics.
6. Business 410.
7. Natural Science 496.
8. Select one of the following emphases: Biology or Analysis.
 - a. Biology emphasis:
 - 1) Biology 302 or 307.
 - 2) Biology 310.
 - 3) Eight additional credits in 300/400 level biology courses (**Biology 353 is strongly recommended**).
 - b. Analysis emphasis:
 - 1) Chemistry 203, 205, and 206 (or 322). These also count toward the core requirement for 16 credits of chemistry.
 - 2) Mathematics 235 or 236.
 - 3) Physics 107, 108.
9. The following courses are strongly recommended: Geology 107, Economics 203, Political Science 101 and 243. The following courses are recommended: Economics 204, Political Science 213 and 234.
