The Zenon C.R. Hansen Leadership Program

The Hansen Leadership Program (HLP) is the college's comprehensive approach toward leadership development. Doane College believes that leadership skills are inherent within every person, and stresses the importance of principled leadership based on core values. These core values include: Inclusiveness, Empowerment, Service, Accountability, Proactive, and Integrity.

Leadership requires responsible action in people in every part of society, not those simply in positional leadership skills. HLP's mission is to be the avenue through which strong character and leadership skills are cultivated by actively leading and serving others in order to impact all lives, now and in the future.

Students have the opportunity to participate in several components of the program, including:

- ❑ Workshops, retreats, lectures and self-assessments
- ❑ Service and volunteer opportunities
- ❑ Progressive tracking of leadership development and campus involvement
- ❑ Interactions with faculty, staff and alumni

Doane College Honors Program

The Honors Program is designed to enrich, in a variety of ways, the educational experience of selected Doane students. Specialized, interdisciplinary, one-credit honors (302) seminars form the intellectual core of the program. One other important component of the Honors Program is a study abroad experience undertaken during the junior or senior year. The culminating experience is a collaborative research project carried out by all honors students

during their final spring semester at Doane. Student initiative, creativity, and leadership are expected in all phases of the program.

Honors students take Honors 200 seminar during the spring semester of their first year and Honor 302 during three out of the following four on-campus semesters. During their final spring semester, all honors students must take Honors 402, a collaborative research project.

Application

All first-year students will be invited to apply for the Honors Program during their first fall semester at Doane College. Students must fill out an application and submit an essay. The selection process will take place during the fall semester. The new honors cohort will begin the Honors Program in the following spring semester.

Criteria for Admission

Students will be selected for entry into the Honors Program by the Honors Program Committee and the Vice President for Academic Affairs. Talented students will be screened according to their academic potential, written and oral communication skills, accomplishments and talents, leadership, and commitment to academic excellence.

Criteria to Remain in the Honors Program

Once in the Honors Program, the student must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.50. A student whose grade point average falls below 3.50 may appeal to the Honors Program Committee to continue in the program.

Criteria to Graduate from the Honors Program

In addition to the graduation requirements for all students, the Honors students must:

1. Fulfill the requirements of the program as specified in the Honors Handbook.
2. Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.50.

If these criteria are met, an honors designation will appear on the student's transcript after graduation.

Outcomes

1. Students will demonstrate an understanding of the global dimension of each theme studied.
2. Students will produce a collaborative cross-discipline final project.
3. Students will demonstrate the ability to participate in another culture.
4. Students will demonstrate a commitment to intellectual endeavor as a lifelong learning goal.
5. Students will show evidence of having completed an intellectually challenging curriculum.
6. Students will demonstrate an appreciation of cultural and artistic performance.
7. Students will develop a sense of social responsibility toward their community.
8. Students will demonstrate leadership in academic endeavors, service learning and/or cocurricular activities.

The Doane College Learning Community

The Doane Learning Community is designed to provide students the option of not only hearing about connections between courses and activities, but to actually experience those connections. Each semester, several courses will be offered that are linked to other courses and experiences. The links range from sharing assignments between the courses, having students take all of the courses together, or offering a single, unique course built around an interdisciplinary theme taught by a team of faculty. Students participating in learning community links will experience connections and ideas; engage in learning in an interdisciplinary setting; develop useful skills and strategies; get to know new friends and faculty; and have fun in a unique learning environment. The Doane Learning Community deliberately prepares students to succeed in a diverse, complicated world. Career Development

Doane's Career Development Center provides opportunities for students to assess their career interests and goals, explore career options, or help in choosing a major.

Experiential education is an important component at Doane, and Career Development offers internship resources and supervision. Job search assistance with resume and cover letter development, mock interviewing, and job postings are available and appointments are not needed for services. The Career Library contains books on career fields, internships, job search, graduate programs, and graduate test preparation. Workshops on various subjects are offered throughout the year, and a Spring Career and Graduate School Fair is held every year.

Military Science

Military science courses are available to Doane students through a cooperative program with the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Military science is not an academic major, but credits earned in military science courses apply toward graduation from Doane. Courses are taught by UNL military science personnel and are primarily offered on the UNL campus. Upon successful completion of the Advanced Course of ROTC and upon recommendation by the military science faculty at UNL and the Vice President for Academic Affairs at Doane College, students may be commissioned during the graduation ceremony when they earn their Doane degree. Army ROTC students are commissioned as Second Lieutenant, United States Army Reserve or Regular Army. Air Force ROTC students are commissioned as Second Lieutenant, United States Air Force.

Pre-Professional Programs

Doane College does not offer majors in many of the pre-professional programs, but it does provide foundation courses for future study at other institutions. Students who are enrolled in pre-professional programs at Doane for two or three years and complete their Doane degree elsewhere must complete all Doane Plan courses prior to transferring and the interterm requirement as follows:

Pre-Engineering

Students may pursue an engineering degree at Doane by participating in the Doane College Dual Degree Program. This program allows students to earn two degrees: a B.A. or B.S. from Doane and a B.S. in engineering or applied science from an engineering school.

Students completing the three-year pre-professional program at Doane before transferring to the engineering school of their choice may graduate from Doane by successfully completing the first year of engineering school and all other Doane graduation requirements. Students maintaining a 3.0 GPA at Doane are guaranteed admission into affiliated programs at Columbia University and Washington University. Students also have the option of pursuing a graduate degree in engineering. Participants in the dual degree program can often complete

the M.S. degree with one additional year of study at the engineering school.

Pre-Forestry

Doane participates in a cooperative program run by the Nicholas School of the Environment at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina. This program includes a 3-2 arrangement with Duke, which makes it possible for Doane students to enter the School of the Environment after completing three years at Doane. After two more years at Duke, a student may qualify for a baccalaureate degree from Doane and a master's degree from the School of the Environment.

The Nicholas School of the Environment and Earth Sciences offers a Master of Forestry (M.F.) and a Master of Environmental Management (M.E.M.). The M.E.M. program offers several areas of emphasis, including Coastal Environmental Management, Environmental Economics and Policy, Water and Air Resources, Conservation Science and Policy, Ecosystem Science and Management, Environmental Health and Security, or Global Environmental Change.

Pre-Law

The American Bar Association states that undergraduates can be admitted to law school from almost every academic discipline. Students are encouraged to pursue an area of study that develops research and writing skills, analytic/problem solving skills, critical reading abilities, and oral communication/ listening abilities.

Law School 3/3 Program with Accredited Law Schools, including the University of Nebraska Law School. Students may earn degrees from Doane College and an accredited law school in a 6-year period through the College's law school 3/3 program. Students who are admitted to an accredited law school, including the University of Nebraska Law School, may receive a bachelor's degree from Doane College if the student meets all graduation requirements of Doane College and successfully completes the first year of law school.

Except for the final 30 hours in residence, students must complete all Doane graduation requirements including the Doane Plan and the interterm requirement. Students must earn a major at Doane College or transfer approved coursework from the first year of law school to complete their major. The final 30 hours in residence will be waived for students completing the first full-year of law school in the 3/3 program. Students should consult with their major department early in their program of studies about the coursework which may be transferred to complete their major.

Medical, Dental and Allied Health

Doane offers pre-professional coursework in most medical areas. The most frequently requested of these programs are: Pre-Dentistry, Pre-Medical Technology, Pre-Medicine, Pre-Nursing, Pre-Optometry, Pre-Physician's Assistant, Pre-Physical Therapy, and Pre-Occupational Therapy.

Doane students can complete their professional education in these allied health programs at medical institutions across the United States and may qualify for graduation from Doane by successfully completing the first year of an approved professional program, as well as all other Doane graduation requirements. For these students, the 30-hour residency requirement is waived.

Pre-Ministry

The best preparation for a career in the Christian ministry is a four-year liberal arts course preparatory to graduate work at a seminary. Students interested in religious education or missionary work, as well as pre-ministerial students, can also prepare by taking specific courses in religion, philosophy, literature, history, social studies, music, and theatre.

Pre-Veterinary Medicine

Many students are interested in veterinary science, and Doane offers all pre-veterinary requirements for area veterinary schools and most schools nationwide.

Off-Campus and Study Abroad Options

Doane recognizes the importance of international education to a liberal arts education. The purpose of Doane College is to educate students to serve and lead in the state, nation, and the world. Doane students are encouraged to develop a global perspective by engaging in cross-cultural learning through study abroad. Doane is committed to educating students for global citizenship and providing first-hand opportunities for our students to develop a global perspective by:

- Stimulating the quest for knowledge of global issues by integrating international perspectives into the curriculum
- Providing greater exposure to different belief systems by connecting components of the learning experience beyond the classroom
- Creating a campus environment which embraces local, national and global diversity
- Providing opportunities for our students to hone their leadership skills through meaningful cross-cultural programs
- Compelling students to challenge themselves through study abroad

Office of International Programs

The Office of International Programs is charged with administering and promoting programs and activities that provide international educational opportunities. The office on International Programs provides the following services:

The faculty committee on International Education serves as an advisory group to the office.
- **International Student Advising**
The International Student Advising Center provides assistance for students with issues relating to immigration and the SEVIS system.
- **Midwest Institute for International Studies Special Programs**
The Institute provides special programs for international students in English language and culture.
- **Study Abroad Advising**
The Study Abroad Advising Center provides assistance for students who wish to integrate study abroad into their academic program.

Objectives for Study Abroad:

Doane students generally apply to one semester or year-long program in order to enhance their liberal arts academic program. Students meet with their academic adviser and the study abroad adviser to determine which programs are most closely related to their educational and personal goals. Study abroad is a life-changing experience, and determining the appropriate program helps maximize the benefit of the study abroad experience. Students may choose a program to enhance their major, improve their ability in a foreign language, to gain a greater

understanding of other academic subjects, or to experience life in another culture.

More than 100 Doane students participated in study abroad in short term and semester long programs in 2006-2007. International programs are available in over 40 countries. Fluency in a foreign language is not required. Many programs provide instruction in English, while other programs provide instruction in a foreign language. Through this program, students may study in a variety of programs worldwide, including Australia, Belgium, China, France, and Spain.

Central College

Doane's affiliation with the International Studies Program of Central College provides options to study in Austria, China, England, France, Mexico, Spain, and Wales. General undergraduate studies are available at these universities, and intensive language study is available at most.

Doane Africa Semester Abroad

Students who choose to participate in the Doane Africa semester abroad are charged the tuition rate currently in effect at Doane. If there is an overseas institution involved, the institution is reimbursed by Doane. This policy is subject to change,

based on the exchange rate and the costs of the host institution. If the cost of the overseas program exceeds normal Doane charges, the student is responsible for the additional costs. Students register at Doane for their courses, and grades are determined by the instructor responsible for the overseas study.

For the above agreements, Doane is billed by the host institution, which sets tuition and fees. The student is responsible for all charges.

Goethe Institut

Located in Germany, this institute is devoted to teaching German as a foreign language. Courses at the Goethe Institut begin at the elementary level and progress through intermediate to an advanced level. Incoming students are assigned the appropriate level of study by completing a placement test. Comprehensive exams are given after each group of levels, and certificates and credits are awarded. Students register at Doane for the courses, with the amount of credit determined by the length of the course. Students are charged the tuition rate currently in effect at Doane, and the Goethe Institut is then reimbursed. This policy is subject to change, based on the exchange rate and the costs of attending the Goethe Institut.

Summers Abroad

Students who study abroad during the summer can use the travel scholarship as financial aid. Freshman and sophomore students may choose to participate in short-term summer study abroad in preparation for semester or year-long study abroad during their junior or senior years.

Study abroad is an essential element of a well-rounded liberal arts education. Although summer study abroad is very different than a semester abroad experience, it can be an excellent alternative for students who cannot spend a semester off campus for academic, financial or extra-curricular reasons. Summer study abroad programs are available in a wide variety of academic subjects in over 30 countries. Students interested in summer study abroad may obtain detailed information by contacting Janet Willems in the Office of International Programs.

Types of Programs

Study abroad programs provide the opportunity to deepen a liberal arts education and to expand skills related to a major, emphasis or area of interest. Programs may organize coursework around a specific major such as chemistry, biology or business, or around a common theme such as gender development, the complexities of globalization and development or environmental issues. Instruction relating to the host country is generally included upon arrival.

Programs may be operated by Doane faculty, U.S.-based organizations, institutions abroad, or a consortium of cooperating institutions. Programs vary widely, and may offer traditional classroom instruction, experiential learning, community service, independent study and internships.

Faculty Led Programs

Special short-term international study/travel courses are offered each year during interterm. Courses may take place in January during the interterm period, or in May and June following graduation. Faculty lead international travel courses and students earn academic credit. In recent years international interterm travel courses include trips to India, Africa, Japan, China, Thailand, Australia, New Zealand, Italy, Greece, France, Germany, Scotland, United Kingdom, Mexico, Belize and the Caribbean. All participants are expected to attend mandatory information sessions the semester before traveling abroad.

Featured Study Semester and Year-Long Abroad Programs

Africa

Semester Abroad in Africa (Doane)

Under the direction of Doane Professor Dr. Betty Levitov, Doane students spend a semester of study together in Africa.

Gaborone, Botswana (CIEE)

Immerse yourself in the local culture and choose courses focusing on Southern Africa.

Accra, Ghana (CIEE)

This program offers an intense curriculum of African Studies- courses in music, dance, archaeology, history, political science and sociology. Or study business, liberal arts, or computer science.

Legon, Ghana (CIEE)

Study West African culture, the political and economic challenges facing sub-Saharan Africa and developing nations in general, or chose from a wide variety of other subjects. Internships are available.

Dakar, Senegal (CIEE)

Live and study in a wide variety of subjects in English in a highly democratic, French-speaking West African country. Internships for credit are available.

Capetown, South Africa (CIEE)

This program offers an arts and sciences or service-learning emphasis. Learn about contemporary South African life or a wide variety of academic subjects.

Stellenbosch, South Africa (CIEE)

With an arts and sciences emphasis, students may choose to study the transformation of South Africa alongside local students.

Asia**Beijing, China (CIEE)**

With an emphasis on ethnic studies and Chinese language, this program offers a social sciences look at China's ethnic minorities and the Chinese identity.

Hangzhou, China (Central)

All coursework is taught by Zhejiang University faculty, the faculty of the International College of Zhejiang University, and Central College faculty. Students are required to enroll in at least ten credits of Chinese language and culture and the 1 credit China Seminar. All students are strongly encouraged to enroll in the ESL internship course. Courses are offered at a variety of language levels to accommodate students with or without previous Chinese language skills.

Shanghai, China (CIEE)

Learn about Chinese international affairs, economics, and history in addition to Mandarin Chinese language instruction from beginner to advanced.

Hyderabad, India (CIEE)

Understand India's religious traditions while studying a variety of academic subjects at an Indian University. Instruction in one of India's languages is included.

Tokyo, Japan (CIEE)

Learn Japanese language at any level, and Japanese culture and a wide variety of other academic disciplines through classes taught in English.

Seoul, South Korea (CIEE)

Learn the Korean language at any level, and Korean culture and a wide variety of other academic subjects through classes taught in English.

Khon Kaen, Thailand (CIEE)

With an emphasis on development and globalization, this program offers students the ability to engage in hands-on field study to understand the complexities of development, globalization, and environmental issues.

Hanoi, Vietnam (CIEE)

Gain insight into the culture and present-day situation in Vietnam through coursework in culture and language.

Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam and Siem Riep, Cambodia (CIEE)

Develop a solid foundation in the economics, political science, and history of Vietnam and Cambodia while immersing yourself in local communities.

Australia**Perth, Australia (CIEE)**

Study a wide variety of liberal arts subjects or pursue interests in Australia's indigenous culture, cross-cultural studies, science (biology, marine biology, ecology, the environment) or the outdoors; undertake a for-credit internship if you choose.

Sydney, Australia (CIEE)

Study a wide variety of liberal arts, studio arts, psychology, business, science, media, communications, gender studies, Jewish studies, Australia-themed courses, or visual arts. Internships are available.

Wollongong, Australia (CIEE)

Study humanities or science and Australian culture in a city known for its cosmopolitan culture.

Europe

Vienna, Austria (Central)

Study German at all levels. Internships and service learning programs are available.

Brussels, Belgium (CIEE)

Study international affairs, communication, and business in the headquarters of the European Union while learning French, Dutch at all levels. Internships for credit are available.

Prague, Czech Republic (CIEE)

Study the political, social and economic transformation of the Czech Republic and Central Europe while learning the Czech language and culture. Film studies are available.

Colchester, England (Central)

Rural England is the setting of this program. Instruction is provided in English.

Lancaster, England (Lancaster University)

This program offers Doane students a variety of flexible programs designed to incorporate opportunities for them to explore Europe even as they earn their credits.

London, England (CIEE)

Enroll in a wide variety of subjects including science, social science, humanities and art. Internships are available.

London, England (Central)

Learn about London and Britain while experiencing British life and culture and courses covering aspects of history, politics, business, and theatre and will help you develop

the background you need to begin to understand Britain. Internships are an important part of this study program.

London, England (ISA)

The University of Middlesex and University of Westminster host studies in a wide variety of courses.

Redding, England (ISA)

Courses in the liberal arts are taught in English on the University of Redding campus.

Paris, France (CIEE)

Take courses in English or French. Improve your French at all levels, study a wide variety of courses.

Paris, France (Central)

This program offers a wide variety of choices for students of French at all levels. Coursework includes studies in business, culture, literature and French. Internships are available.

Paris, France (ISA)

The Sorbonne and Catholic University host programs in French language, culture and civilization. Courses are taught in French and English.

Rennes, France (CIEE)

Turn your intermediate French skills into fluency while gaining an understanding of the French and their culture. Instruction is provided in French, and advanced coursework in French is available.

Bonn, Germany (Goethe)

A combination of language training, culture and leisure enable students at all levels to learn German systematically. The language experience culminates in an ALTE examination.

Bremen, Germany (Goethe)

The program in this Hanseatic city

provides a combination of language training, culture and leisure enable students at all levels to learn German systematically. The language experience culminates in an ALTE examination.

Freiburg, Germany (Goethe)

Dedicated to teaching German as a foreign language on the western slopes of the Black Forest.

Gottingen, Germany (Goethe)

Program themes include German for teachers and intensive German in this culturally rich city in central Germany.

Schwabisch Hall, Germany (Goethe)

Dedicated to teaching German as a foreign language in this lively artistic, cultural and economic center of Germany.

Budapest, Hungary (CIEE)

Examine the political, social and economic transformation of Hungary and Central Europe while learning Hungarian language and culture. Internships are available. Instruction provided in English and Hungarian.

Dublin, Ireland (CIEE)

Study a wide variety of subjects such as international relations, business, or communications alongside Irish students. Internships for credit are available.

Ferrara, Italy (CIEE)

Immerse yourself in the culture of a small renaissance city while improving your beginner Italian- or study the language for the first time! Instruction provided in English and Italian.

Florence, Italy (ISA)

Program themes include liberal arts, architecture and Italian studies. Courses are taught in English and Italian.

Florence, Italy (SACI)

This highly competitive program provides courses in a wide variety of academic and studio subjects at multiple levels.

Rome, Italy (ISA)

The American University hosts a wide variety of courses in English and Italian.

Amsterdam, The Netherlands (CIEE)

Develop an understanding of the social, political and cultural realities of a multicultural international city while developing your interest in the humanities and social sciences. Instruction is provided in English and

Leiden, the Netherlands (Central)

Students may enroll in a wide variety of semester courses following the orientation period and intensive Dutch course. All students are required to enroll in "The Netherlands and its European Context", The remainder of the schedule can be completed with courses selected from Central College offerings, Webster University or Leiden University offerings. Independent study and internships are available.

Warsaw, Poland (CIEE)

Learn the Polish language and culture while studying business, economics and the transformation of Poland.

Lisbon, Portugal (CIEE)

Develop an understanding of Portuguese contributions to history as you develop your language skills. Coursework provided in English and Portuguese.

St. Petersburg, Russia (CIEE)

Develop and understanding of Russian culture as you begin or improve your Russian language skills at all levels. Instruction provided in English and Russian.

Alcala, Spain (CIEE)

The program's language of instruction is Spanish. You will choose from courses in art history, business, history, linguistics, literature, political science and Spanish.

Alicante, Spain (CIEE)

Courses are taught in Spanish and English with coursework in art and art history, economics film, history, literature, political science and Spanish. Program themes include language in context, language and culture and the liberal arts.

Barcelona, Spain (CIEE)

Instruction is provided in English and Spanish at all levels. Program themes include liberal arts and business/culture.

Barcelona, Spain (ISA)

Program themes include Hispanic studies, language, culture and economics, Spanish language and liberal arts and Spanish language and culture. Courses are taught in English and Spanish.

Grenada, Spain (Central)

All courses are taught in Spanish. There are two types of programs from which a student may choose: intensive language and culture or language and liberal arts courses.

Grenada, Spain (ISA)

Courses are offered in English and Spanish with a wide variety of liberal arts course offerings.

Madrid, Spain (CIEE)

Instruction is provided in Spanish. Coursework includes studies in business, economics, engineering, European studies, humanities, journalism, law, political science, sociology, statistics and Spanish.

Madrid, Spain (ISA)

Liberal arts, Spanish language and culture, and Hispanic studies are program

themes. Instruction is provided in English and Spanish.

Malaga, Spain (ISA)

The University of Malaga is the host institution. Program themes include intensive Spanish and Spanish language and culture.

Palma de Mallorca, Spain (CIEE)

Business and tourism is the theme of this program. Instruction is provided in Spanish with coursework in business, economics, marketing, tourism, Spanish language and culture. Internships are available.

Salamanca, Spain (ISA)

Hispanic studies and Spanish language and culture are program themes. Courses are taught in Spanish.

Santander, Spain (ISA)

The University of Catrabria hosts programs in Spanish language and culture. Instruction is provided in Spanish.

Sevilla, Spain (ISA)

Courses in the liberal arts are taught in English and Spanish. Program themes include Hispanic studies, geography history Spanish language and culture or Spanish language and literature.

Seville, Spain (CIEE)

Liberal arts, teaching development, international business and language, and international business and society are the themes of CIEE's programs in Seville. Coursework is provided in English and Spanish and includes studies in business, education, humanities, social sciences and Spanish language. Internships are available.

Valencia, Spain (ISA)

The University of Valencia provides instruction in Spanish, Program

themes are Spanish language and culture or Spanish language and literature.

Bangor, Wales (Central)

Students may enroll in a wide variety of semester courses after completing an introduction to Wales.

Latin America

Buenos Aires, Argentina (CIEE)

Turn your interest in social sciences and humanities into an in-depth knowledge of Argentine and South American politics, economics, history, literature and society. Instruction is provided in Spanish.

Buenos Aires, Argentina (ISA)

Program themes include liberal arts, language and culture and Latin American studies. Instruction is provided in English and Spanish.

Bonaire, Southern Caribbean (CIEE)

Tropical marine ecology and conservation are the themes of this program. Study tropical ecosystems of the Southern Caribbean by combining classroom study with field-based observation, hiking, and scuba diving. Courses are available in English and Spanish.

Monteverde, Costa Rica (CIEE)

Tropical ecology and conservation is the theme of the program. Study in a cloud forest by combining intensive theoretical and taxonomic coursework with field-based observation through travel to various ecosystems. Instruction is provided in English and Spanish.

San Jose, Costa Rica (ISA)

Courses are taught in English and Spanish in a wide variety of courses in the liberal arts.

Santiago, Chile (CIEE)

The language of instruction is Spanish. Coursework in contemporary issues and cultural patterns are taught alongside Chilean students.

Valparaiso, Chile (CIEE)

Enroll in regular university coursework in a wide variety of subjects alongside Chilean students as you study the life and society of Chile.

Valparaiso, Chile (ISA)

A wide variety of courses and program themes are offered. Instruction in Spanish is provided.

Santiago, Dominican Republic (CIEE)

The theme of this program is the liberal arts. Coursework is taught in Spanish as you learn about the society, culture, economics and politics of the Dominican republic and the Caribbean.

Santiago, Dominican Republic (ISA)

Program themes include language, culture, and environmental studies, Spanish language and Latin American culture. Spanish is the language of instruction.

Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic (ISA)

Instruction is provided in Spanish. Develop and understanding of the realities of Dominican society and the Caribbean region. Internships are available.

Guanajuato, Mexico (CIEE)

Advance your beginner and applied Spanish language skills quickly while learning about Mexican culture, history and society. Instruction is provided in English and Spanish.

Guanajuato, Mexico (ISA)

The University of Guanajuato hosts programs in Spanish language and culture. Spanish is the language of instruction.

Merida, Mexico (Central)

All course work, with the exception of Spanish language and Marista University courses, is taught in English. Language instruction in Spanish is available at all levels.

Xalapa, Mexico (ISA)

Courses are taught in English and Spanish. A wide variety of courses are offered.

Lima, Peru (CIEE)

Language and culture, liberal arts and business and society are the themes of the CIEE programs in Lima. Advance your beginner or intermediate Spanish skills while learning about Peruvian culture, history, and society. Instruction is provided in English and Spanish.

Lima, Peru (ISA)

Located on the coast of central Peru, coursework in Spanish includes Latin American Studies, economics, and Spanish language and culture.

Middle East

Amman, Jordan (CIEE)

Learn about Jordan and the Middle East with opportunities for

service learning and coursework in Arabic, humanities, social sciences, and media. Courses are taught in Arabic and English.

Ankara, Turkey (CIEE)

Courses are taught in English and Turkish in a wide variety of subjects.

Multi-Country Programs

Europe (ISA)

Students experience the diversity of Western Europe as they study in Rome, Paris, and Madrid.

Latin America (ISA)

Guanajuato, Lima, and Buenos Aires are explored as students experience the language and culture of Latin America.

Transfer Policy for Study Abroad Programs

Generally, courses taken abroad which earn a C- or better are recorded on the student's transcript as "Pass" credit. (Grades below C- are not accepted.) If, however, the course is taken through an approved study abroad program in order to fulfill specific requirements of the French, German, or Spanish major, a letter grade is earned, and is recorded on the transcript as such.
