ABOUT DOANE COLLEGE

When Thomas Doane, chief civil engineer of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, began building the railroad across Nebraska in the late 1800s, his goal was not only to enhance civilized life for the pioneers, but also to build a liberal arts college on the Nebraska frontier. He and the Congregationalists soon chose the town of Crete, overlooking the Big Blue River, for a college on the plains. The college maintains historical ties with the United Church of Christ.

Thomas Doane's vision of a college in the tradition of Harvard and Yale has become a reality. Fully established in 1872, Doane is Nebraska's first private liberal arts and sciences college.

From the college's formative years under the tutelage of first president David Brainerd Perry to the current 11th president, Jonathan Brand, the college continues its purpose to educate students to serve and lead in the state, the nation and the world.

Today, the college serves more than 3,200 students in bachelor's and master's degree programs in Crete, Lincoln, and Grand Island, Neb., and focuses on providing an exceptional educational experience for all students.

Doane College is one of only two schools in Nebraska to be ranked among the top 25 institutions in the Midwest and as one of the Midwest's "best values" in the 2007 U.S. News & World Report College Guide.

The Crete campus serves approximately 1,000 residential students on 300 scenic acres. Designated a state arboretum, the once treeless landscape now boasts more than 100 varieties of trees, numerous plantings, ponds, and swans.

Doane College focuses on providing a student-centered, innovative environment for students and employees. Forty-plus major fields of study are offered, as well as pre-professional programs. More than 80 co-curricular activities and organizations are also available. From national championship athletic programs to music, theatre, and service clubs, students pursue many varied interests outside the classroom.



Leadership development underscores the students' experience in all aspects of the college. Doane's unique Hansen Leadership Program works with students to help enhance their leadership skills and talents, through speakers and events, alumni

mentors, course offerings, community service, and other activities.

Additional highlights include the four-year graduation guarantee for students...graduate within four years or the college will pay for a fifth year of course work. A travel scholarship for students provides opportunities to travel on college-sponsored trips in the U.S. or abroad. Doane College was the first institution in the nation to initiate a warranty for its education graduates to hiring school districts, and guarantees teacher education graduates a position.

Doane College also offers three graduate degree programs, including the Master of Arts in Management (MAM), Master of Arts in Counseling (MAC), and Master of Education (MED) in Curriculum and Instruction or Educational Leadership.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT CENTER

The transition from high school to college level academics is a dramatic one, but it need not be traumatic if students make use of the resources Doane College provides through the Academic Support Center (ASC).



In contrast to many students' high school course experiences, most college level courses demand a whole new study and exam preparation strategy. Most college professors fully expect that students will complete the assigned textbook readings and come to class prepared to ask questions and engage in discussion generated by the reading assignment. Professors' lectures complement and supplement the required reading assignment, but they are not intended to substitute for required readings.

Likewise, students must attend lectures and labs if they are to gain the full benefit of their educational opportunity. Completing the assigned readings, attending lectures and labs, being able to record accurate reading/lecture notes and reviewing their notes regularly in preparation for exams and finals are all critical to any student's academic success.

Doane's Academic Support Center (ASC) provides academic assistance, training and intervention to students who wish to improve their academic performance. The ASC consists of two separate programs: The Doane Learning Center (DLC) and Doane Student Support Services (DSS). Both programs are housed in the Student Services area on the lower level of Perry Campus Center.

The Doane Learning Center is a walk-in center for students wanting to raise their grades or improve their study skills. The program provides academic counseling, peer tutoring, and writing assistance.

Doane Student Support Services (DSS) is a TRIO program, federally funded through the United States Department of Education. It assists eligible students in reaching their academic and personal goals through a variety of activities. Notification of eligibility is sent to new students in the first few weeks of the fall and spring terms and is dependent on American citizenship AND family income level, (or) student disability status or both custodial parents/guardians having less than a four-year degree.



DOANE FACILITIES

The Doane College athletic facilities continue to change and improve each year.

Simon Field was constructed in 1929 following a generous gift from G. Eli Simon, a Cambridge, Nebraska, attorney and father of a graduating senior. Simon Field is located on the north side of the campus and is home to the football and soccer teams. Lauritsen Track surrounds the field and is home to the track & field teams.

Field turf was installed in 2000. As part of the renovation, a new outdoor, polyurethane track was also installed. Both the field and track are used by the Crete community and Crete High School. The press box was wired with Internet capabilities in the summer of 2004.



Located on the eastern end of campus, **The Den** is the alternate home to Doane soccer. The first home of Doane Soccer, The Den is a grass surface used mostly for practices.

Located on the northeast end of the Doane campus, **Fuhrer Field House** is home to Tiger volleyball, men's & women's basketball, and indoor track & field. The Field House is also used for early season practices for baseball, softball, and tennis. Fuhrer Field House underwent a major renovation starting in the winter of 2001. Changes of notice are new bleachers that allow for 1,900 fans, including portable bleachers that sit in the end zones of the court to bring the fans closer, a movement of the court floor closer to the main bleachers, a new mondo track surface, new lights, wiring, and speakers, and wall pictures hung to display each Tiger sport. The renovation of the athletic training room is the most recent improvement to the facility.

The **Jose M. & Elizabeth Ledon Softball and Baseball Complex** opened in March 2007. The complex is located on the east end of campus and is home to Tiger baseball and softball. The facility includes batting cages, a two-story press box and concession stand.

Greg Heier took over as Athletic Director in May 2006. Heier played four years at Doane on the men's basketball team guided by NAIA Hall-of-Fame coach Bob Erickson beginning with the 1981-82 season and ending with the 1984-85 season. Heier earned his B.S. degree in Political Science in 1985 and a J.D. degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1988. Heier also served as an assistant basketball coach for the Tigers from 1998-2002. During that time, Heier helped coach the last men's basketball team to have won a post-season conference championship and earn a spot in the NAIA Division II National Championship Tournament. Prior to serving as Athletic Director, Heier practiced law from 1988 until 1998 and worked in human resources and risk management for Doane from 1998 until 2006. He has been a life long fan of Doane Tiger Athletics!

Athletic Trainers



Stefanie Kindt became the Tigers' Head Athletic Trainer in 1997. She is a 1991 graduate of North Dakota State University, Fargo, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training. She has a Master's degree from the University of Florida, Gainesville, in Exercise and Sports Sciences. Kindt is a Certified Athletic Trainer through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and a Certified Strength and

Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). She is also an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.



Brad Jenny joined the Tiger athletic training staff in 1999 as assistant Athletic Trainer. He is a 1993 graduate of Doane College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with an Athletic Training emphasis. He has a Master's degree in HPER (health, physical education and recreation) from Northern State University in Aberdeen, S.D., where he served as a graduate assistant Athletic Trainer for one year. Brad is

certified through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and also holds a CSCS through the NSCA.

DOANE MEDIA INFORMATION



The Doane College Sports Information Office is always interested in helping members of the media in their coverage of Tiger Athletics. Athlete features and interviews, credential request, photographs and statistics are available through the sports information office.

Rick Schmuecker joined the Tiger team in August 2001 as Assistant Sports Information Director, following four years as a student at Midland Lutheran College. In May 2006, he was named head of the Sports Information Department by Athletic Director Greg Heier.

At Doane, Rick is seen at all home athletic events, usually in the designated media areas, either keep stats, broadcasting or both. He has received publication honors by the NAIA-SIDA in football and soccer as well as with the Doane athletic Web site. ABOUT THE GPAC

The Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) is an affiliated conference of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), consisting of 13 private, faith-based colleges and universities in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota.



Originally founded in 1969 as the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NIAC), the league retains all six of its charter members - Concordia, Dana, Doane, Hastings, Midland Lutheran and Nebraska Wesleyan. In 1992, the NIAC added Northwestern and became the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference. Eight years later, Dakota Wesleyan, Dordt, Mount Marty and Sioux Falls joined the conference which became the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) in 2000-2001. Briar Cliff entered the league in 2002-2003 and Morningside became the 13th member a year later. Both schools are in Sioux City, Iowa.

Beginning with the 2005-2006 school year, the GPAC started awarding the Christopherson All-Academic Award. The award is a traveling trophy to be presented annually to the GPAC institution with the best academic performance by its student-athletes in all sports. The GPAC has also boasted more than 400 scholar-athletes each of the last two years.

The GPAC has 15 NAIA National Champions...

In 2000-2001 the Northwestern women and men won NAIA Division II National Basketball Championships, while the Doane women shared the outdoor NAIA Track and Field title. 2001-2002 brought two NAIA titles to our league. The Hastings women won the NAIA Division II National Basketball title, while Doane's women won the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship outright. In 2002-2003 the GPAC won two more National Championships with the Hastings women repeating as NAIA Division II National Basketball Champions, and the Northwestern men winning the NAIA Division II crown for the second time in three years. The Morningside women's basketball teams won the 2004 and 2005 titles in front of the hometown Sioux City fans at the Tyson Events Center. In 2006 the Hastings women's basketball team won their third basketball title in five years. The GPAC won six straight NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championships from 2001 to 2006. Also, in 2006 Dana College claimed the NAIA National Wrestling Championship, while the Nebraska Wesleyan's men's golf team won the NCAA III National Title. In the fall of 2006 when Sioux Falls won the Football National Championship in Savannah, Tennessee. The Northwestern women's basketball team capped a 35-2 season in winning the 2008 NAIA Division II National Championship. The University of Sioux Falls won their second NAIA Football Title in three years by claiming the 2008 National Championship in Rome, Georgia, on December 20. In March of 2009 the Morningside Women's Basketball team capped a perfect 38-0 season by claiming the NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Championship. The title game was an All-GPAC matchup as Hastings claimed Runner-Up honors. The GPAC has now won eight of the last nine NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Championships!

2009 PRESEASON OUTLOOK

If preseason polls have any insight on how good a team will be, the 2009 Tigers will have one of their best squads ever. However, the preseason polls mean little when the season rolls around because the games still need to be played between the lines.

For third-year coach Greg Jarosik, keeping his players focused on the task at hand will be one of the top priorities after the conference coaches picked Doane to finish in second place this season. Only Hastings is ahead of the Tigers and deservedly so as they have never finished lower than No. 1 in the GPAC. Yes - that's nine straight conference titles since the GPAC formed in 2000.

With several key players back and good talent coming in, the Tigers will need to find consistency in scoring and in defensive play. Doane was shutout five times last year, including the final three games of the season. Returning is leading goal scorer, Devon Strecker. He finished second in the GPAC in goals with 12 and earned Second Team All-GPAC honors. Monday Akogwu battled injuries but still posted a solid year in joining Strecker on the GPAC Second Team.

In all, Doane returns their Top 5 goal scorers as Kyle Smith, Jordan Schafer and Jace Peters return as well. Eight starters return to the team as the Tigers hope to avoid injuries as they try to push the Broncos this season. Defense will be key as there were moments where it seemed the Tigers broke down at inopportune times. A strong defensive effort, along with consistent goalie play from three-year starter Chris Kavinsky, will go along way for potential success this season.

When the Tigers enter conference play in mid-September, they will be battled tested. The season opens with games against preseason No. 12 Bellevue University and No. 5 Concordia (CA) on the road. Throw in a game against Vanguard who is No. 22 and a traditionally strong team in William Jewell and the Tigers may not have a pretty record as they start the GPAC.

However, if the Tigers put together a strong run through the opening weeks, a GPAC title run could be insight. Avoiding teams with upset in mind will be important as well in conference play as there are always several tough teams ready to make a move towards the top of the conference race. If the Tigers can find themselves in position to make a run at the Broncos, an advantage going into the Hastings game might just be that the game is at home, a place where many magical moments occurred a year ago.

2008 SEASON RECAP

The men's soccer team qualified for the GPAC post-season tournament for the first time since 2005 and posted their first winning record for the first time since 2004. The Tigers, under second-year Head Coach Greg Jarosik, went 10-9 overall and 7-5 in the GPAC.

An eight game win streak, a school record, propelled the Tigers early on. However, a rough final stretch saw the Tigers get shutout in the final three games of the year, including a 1-0 loss on a penalty kick in double overtime of the GPAC tournament.

The Tigers opened the season with three straight losses against strong competition. Robert Morris held off the Tigers 2-1 and Illinois Tech topped the Tigers 4-0. In the home opener, William Jewell edged Doane, 2-1.

The first win of the year came against Avila, 3-2. The Tigers followed with another 3-2 win, this one coming over Ottawa. Returning home, Doane pitched a shutout of Tabor College, 1-0.

The three-game winning streak carried the Tigers into the early stages of conference play. Doane topped Midland Lutheran, 3-1 as Deven Strecker picked up a pair of goals. Doane won back-to-back overtime games, defeating Dordt (2-1) and Concordia (3-2). Jordan Schafer scored the final two goals for the Tigers. Doane smothered Briar Cliff, 6-1, as Strecker and Bryce Petersen scored two goals apiece.

In perhaps the most exciting game of the year, Doane defeated Dana in overtime, 3-2. The Tigers picked up a goal from Jace Peters with four seconds remaining in regulation. Kyle Smith picked up the game-winner as Sean Dougherty collected assists on the final two goals.

The excitement of the Dana game which produced the eighth straight win would come to a halt in the next game as Morningside won, 2-1. Sioux Falls followed with a 5-3 win and Nebraska Wesleyan edged the Tigers, 1-0.

The Tigers got back on the winning track with a 5-2 win over Dakota Wesleyan at home. Devon Strecker picked up the hat-trick, scoring the final three goals while Monday Akogwu scored the first two goals of the game for Doane.

In the final home game of the regular season, Doane edged Mount Marty, 2-1. Doane closed the season with back-to-back shutout losses to No. 23 Hastings (2-0) and Northwestern (2-0). The game versus the Red Raiders was a prelude to the GPAC First Round opener as the Tigers would turn around the next week to host Northwestern.

The game was hotly contested throughout and late in double overtime, Doane was called for a foul deep in their own territory and a penalty kick was awarded to Northwestern. The Red Raiders converted and ended Doane's season, 1-0.

Five players earned All-GPAC honors for Doane. Devon Strecker and Monday Akogwu received Second Team honors while Jace Peters, Sean Dougherty and Kyle Smith picked up honorable mention honors.

Doane men's soccer began as an intercollegiate sport in the fall of 1996. The Tigers went 0-13 in that first year under coach Marty Shield. Shield coached the first six seasons of Tiger soccer, winning as many as 12 in 2000. The most wins in a season was in 2002 when Doane went 15-7-1.



Doane is one of a few schools that has two playing surfaces. The Den is a natural grass surface located on the east end of campus while Simon Field (pictured above) is an artificial turf surface that is also used for football and located on the northeast end of campus.

The Tigers have also had some excellent players come through the ranks during the brief existence. Eric Stearns and Rob Triano top the all-time goals scored list with 35. Wilson Herrera is second with 30 goals. Adam Boilesen holds the career assists mark with 26. Stearns is second with 22 career assists.
