ABOUT DOANE COLLEGE

When Thomas Doane, chief civil engineer of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, began building the railroad across Nebraska in the late 1800s, his goal was not only to enhance civilized life for the pioneers, but also to build a liberal arts college on the Nebraska frontier. He and the Congregationalists soon chose the town of Crete, overlooking the Big Blue River, for a college on the plains. The college maintains historical ties with the United Church of Christ.

Thomas Doane's vision of a college in the tradition of Harvard and Yale has become a reality. Fully established in 1872, Doane is Nebraska's first private liberal arts and sciences college.

From the college's formative years under the tutelage of first president David Brainerd Perry to the current 11th president, Jonathan Brand, the college continues its purpose to educate students to serve and lead in the state, the nation and the world.

Today, the college serves more than 3,200 students in bachelor's and master's degree programs in Crete, Lincoln, and Grand Island, Neb., and focuses on providing an exceptional educational experience for all students.

Doane College is one of only two schools in Nebraska to be ranked among the top 25 institutions in the Midwest and as one of the Midwest's "best values" in the 2007 U.S. News & World Report College Guide.

The Crete campus serves approximately 1,000 residential students on 300 scenic acres. Designated a state arboretum, the once treeless landscape now boasts more than 100 varieties of trees, numerous plantings, ponds, and swans.

Doane College focuses on providing a student-centered, innovative environment for students and employees. Forty-plus major fields of study are offered, as well as pre-professional programs. More than 80 co-curricular activities and organizations are also available. From national championship athletic programs to music, theatre, and service clubs, students pursue many varied interests outside the classroom.



Leadership development underscores the students' experience in all aspects of the college. Doane's unique Hansen Leadership Program works with students to help enhance their leadership skills and talents, through speakers and events, alumni

mentors, course offerings, community service, and other activities.

Additional highlights include the four-year graduation guarantee for students...graduate within four years or the college will pay for a fifth year of course work. A travel scholarship for students provides opportunities to travel on college-sponsored trips in the U.S. or abroad. Doane College was the first institution in the nation to initiate a warranty for its education graduates to hiring school districts, and guarantees teacher education graduates a position.

Doane College also offers three graduate degree programs, including the Master of Arts in Management (MAM), Master of Arts in Counseling (MAC), and Master of Education (MED) in Curriculum and Instruction or Educational Leadership.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT CENTER

The transition from high school to college level academics is a dramatic one, but it need not be traumatic if students make use of the resources Doane College provides through the Academic Support Center (ASC).



In contrast to many students' high school course experiences, most college level courses demand a whole new study and exam preparation strategy. Most college professors fully expect that students will complete the assigned textbook readings and come to class prepared to ask questions and engage in discussion generated by the reading assignment. Professors' lectures complement and supplement the required reading assignment, but they are not intended to substitute for required readings.

Likewise, students must attend lectures and labs if they are to gain the full benefit of their educational opportunity. Completing the assigned readings, attending lectures and labs, being able to record accurate reading/lecture notes and reviewing their notes regularly in preparation for exams and finals are all critical to any student's academic success.

Doane's Academic Support Center (ASC) provides academic assistance, training and intervention to students who wish to improve their academic performance. The ASC consists of two separate programs: The Doane Learning Center (DLC) and Doane Student Support Services (DSS). Both programs are housed in the Student Services area on the lower level of Perry Campus Center.

The Doane Learning Center is a walk-in center for students wanting to raise their grades or improve their study skills. The program provides academic counseling, peer tutoring, and writing assistance.

Doane Student Support Services (DSS) is a TRIO program, federally funded through the United States Department of Education. It assists eligible students in reaching their academic and personal goals through a variety of activities. Notification of eligibility is sent to new students in the first few weeks of the fall and spring terms and is dependent on American citizenship AND family income level, (or) student disability status or both custodial parents/guardians having less than a four-year degree.



DOANE FACILITIES

The Doane College athletic facilities continue to change and improve each year.

Located on the northeast end of the Doane campus, **Fuhrer Field House** is home to Tiger volleyball, men's & women's basketball, and indoor track & field. The Field House is also used for early season practices for baseball, softball, and tennis. Fuhrer Field House underwent a major renovation starting in the winter of 2001. Changes of notice are new bleachers that allow for 1,900 fans, including portable bleachers that sit in the end zones of the court to bring the fans closer, a movement of the court floor closer to the main bleachers, a new mondo track surface, new lights, wiring, and speakers, and wall pictures hung to display each Tiger sport. The renovation of the athletic training room is the most recent improvement to the facility.



Simon Field was constructed in 1929 following a generous gift from G. Eli Simon, a Cambridge, Nebraska, attorney and father of a graduating senior. Simon Field is located on the north side of the campus and is home to the football and soccer teams. Lauritsen Track surrounds the field and is home to the track & field teams.

Field turf was installed in 2000. As part of the renovation, a new outdoor, polyurethane track was also installed. Both the field and track are used by the Crete community and Crete High School. The press box was wired with Internet capabilities in the summer of 2004.

Located on the eastern end of campus, **The Den** is the alternate home to Doane soccer. The first home of Doane Soccer, The Den is a grass surface used mostly for practices.

The **Jose M. & Elizabeth Ledon Softball and Baseball Complex** opened in March 2007. The complex is located on the east end of campus and is home to Tiger baseball and softball. The facility includes batting cages, a two-story press box and concession stand.

Athletic Director



Greg Heier took over as Athletic Director in May 2006. Heier played four years at Doane on the men's basketball team guided by NAIA Hall-of-Fame coach Bob Erickson beginning with the 1981-82 season and ending with the 1984-85 season. Heier earned his B.S. degree in Political Science in 1985 and a J.D. degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1988. Heier also served as an assistant basketball coach for the Tigers from 1998-2002. During that time, Heier helped coach the last men's basketball team to have won a post-season conference championship and earn a spot in the NAIA Division II National Championship Tournament. Prior to serving as Athletic Director, Heier practiced law from 1988 until 1998 and worked in human resources and risk management for Doane from 1998 until 2006. He has been a life long fan of Doane Tiger Athletics!

Athletic Trainers



Stefanie Kindt became the Tigers' Head Athletic Trainer in 1997. She is a 1991 graduate of North Dakota State University, Fargo, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training. She has a Master's degree from the University of Florida, Gainesville, in Exercise and Sports Sciences. Kindt is a Certified Athletic Trainer through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and a Certified Strength and

Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). She is also an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.



Brad Jenny joined the Tiger athletic training staff in 1999 as assistant Athletic Trainer. He is a 1993 graduate of Doane College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with an Athletic Training emphasis. He has a Master's degree in HPER (health, physical education and recreation) from Northern State University in Aberdeen, S.D., where he served as a graduate assistant Athletic Trainer for one year. Brad is

certified through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and also holds a CSCS through the NSCA.

DOANE MEDIA INFORMATION



The Doane College Sports Information Office is always interested in helping members of the media in their coverage of Tiger Athletics. Athlete features and interviews, credential request, photographs and statistics are available through the sports information office.

Rick Schmuecker joined the Tiger team in August 2001 as Assistant Sports Information Director, following four years as a student at Midland Lutheran College. In May 2006, he was named head of the Sports Information Department by Athletic Director Greg Heier.

At Doane, Rick is seen at all home athletic events, usually in the designated media areas, either keep stats, broadcasting or both. He has received publication honors by the NAIA-SIDA in football and soccer as well as with the Doane athletic Web site. In June 2008, he received 2nd Place honors for the women's soccer media guide, the highest honor received by himself or Doane through the NAIA-SIDA contests. In 2009, he received 2nd Place in CoSIDA's Special Events publication for the volleyball post-season game program.

ABOUT THE GPAC

The Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) is an affiliated conference of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), consisting of 13 private, faith-based colleges and universities in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota.



Originally founded in 1969 as the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NIAC), the league retains all six of its charter members - Concordia, Dana, Doane, Hastings, Midland Lutheran and Nebraska Wesleyan. In 1992, the NIAC added Northwestern and became the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference. Eight years later, Dakota Wesleyan, Dordt, Mount Marty and Sioux Falls joined the conference which became the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) in 2000-2001. Briar Cliff entered the league in 2002-2003 and Morningside became the 13th member a year later. Both schools are in Sioux City, Iowa.

Beginning with the 2005-2006 school year, the GPAC started awarding the Christopherson All-Academic Award. The award is a traveling trophy to be presented annually to the GPAC institution with the best academic performance by its student-athletes in all sports. The GPAC has also boasted more than 400 scholar-athletes each of the last two years.

The GPAC has 15 NAIA National Champions...

In 2000-2001 the Northwestern women and men won NAIA Division II National Basketball Championships, while the Doane women shared the outdoor NAIA Track and Field title. 2001-2002 brought two NAIA titles to our league. The Hastings women won the NAIA Division II National Basketball title, while Doane's women won the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship outright. In 2002-2003 the GPAC won two more National Championships with the Hastings women repeating as NAIA Division II National Basketball Champions, and the Northwestern men winning the NAIA Division II crown for the second time in three years. The Morningside women's basketball teams won the 2004 and 2005 titles in front of the hometown Sioux City fans at the Tyson Events Center. In 2006 the Hastings women's basketball team won their third basketball title in five years. The GPAC won six straight NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championships from 2001 to 2006. Also, in 2006 Dana College claimed the NAIA National Wrestling Championship, while the Nebraska Wesleyan's men's golf team won the NCAA III National Title. In the fall of 2006 when Sioux Falls won the Football National Championship in Savannah, Tennessee. The Northwestern women's basketball team capped a 35-2 season in winning the 2008 NAIA Division II National Championship. The University of Sioux Falls won their second NAIA Football Title in three years by claiming the 2008 National Championship in Rome, Georgia, on December 20. In March of 2009 the Morningside Women's Basketball team capped a perfect 38-0 season by claiming the NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Championship. The title game was an All-GPAC matchup as Hastings claimed Runner-Up honors. The GPAC has now won eight of the last nine NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Championships!

2009 PRESEASON OUTLOOK

The 2009 Tigers enter the season with high expectations as six of the eight starters in the 6-2 offense return as well as several key bench players that saw action last year. Doane returns three of their five all-conference selections and expect to be very balanced all around which could make the Tigers one of the best teams in the conference.

In the preseason coaches' poll released by the GPAC, Doane was picked fourth which led to a preseason ranking of No. 23 in the NAIA. The Tigers will have an opportunity to prove themselves early and often throughout the season. Doane will open in California and face four teams from the Golden State Athletic Conference (GSAC), a conference that placed seven teams in the national tournament a year ago, including No. 20 Biola. The following week, Doane will travel to the Red Raider Classic and face two teams in No. 4 Azusa Pacific and No. 24 Indiana Wesleyan that advanced to the national tournament a year ago.

The following week the Tigers will participate in the Labor Day Classic and meet up with No. 11 Bellevue on the first day. Doane will have 12 games under their belt when they open conference play at No. 9 Morningside in early September. The Tigers will play their final non-conference games of the regular season at the Hastings Classic before settling in to conference play.

Leading the way are three seniors for Doane. Jessy Livers, Emily Schwisow and Ivie Speer will be relied on in many different ways during their senior year. All three play key rolls within the team and have plenty of experience to help carry the team to another national tournament appearance. Juniors Heather Davison and Nicole Skolnick will also provide leadership. Davison will be in her third year as a Tiger setter and Skolnick will be a key figure in the Tiger back row.

Sophomores dominate the roster as four players saw time last year and will be relied on more this year. Lisa Lord and Kellie Peterson were starters last year and Megan Meduna and Cassie Reicks saw some action but will be asked to play a more prominent roll this year. There will also be a couple of freshmen looking to make an impact throughout the season.

Head Coach Cindy Meyer began her collegiate coaching career at Doane College in 1987 with a victory over the College of St. Mary. Since that time, Meyer's teams have gone to six national tournaments (1990, '94, '97, 2002, '05, '08) and several regional tournaments while her program emphasizes outstanding fundamentals and team cohesiveness. Meyer is the winningest coach in Tiger volleyball history and she has coached six conference players-of-the-year, 12 All-Americans, and 32 NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

In 2006, Meyer picked up her 500th victory as a collegiate coach with a 3-0 victory over Dakota Wesleyan University. On average, it has only taken her three to five years to reach 100 win plateau. She hit win 100 in 1990 with a victory over Washburn University. In 1993, a victory over Midland Lutheran College gave Meyer win 200. Wins 300 & 400 came against Hastings College in 1997 and 2002. Win No. 550 came in the Opening Round of the NAIA National Tournament. The Tigers defeated Bethel College in Crete. Meyer is one of nine active coaches in the NAIA to reach 500 wins entering the 2009 season and ranks 18th all-time in the NAIA with 551 wins entering 2009.

Meyer, associate professor of physical education, earned a bachelor's degree from Wayne State College and a master's degree from Kearney State College (UNK). She began her coaching career at Ainsworth High School, where she led her teams to an 83-30 overall record and four state tournament appearances. Meyer has also established one of the premier summer volleyball camps, drawing hundreds of young student-athletes each year.

2008 SEASON RECAP

The Doane volleyball team used a strong finish to solidify a spot in the NAIA National Tournament, their first bid since 2005. The Tigers ended the season with a 28-10 record and finished fourth in the GPAC.

The season opened with a trip to southern Texas as the Tigers participated at the Texas-Brownsville Classic. Doane went 4-0 and in the process, topped two nationally ranked teams. Upon returning, the team headed north for the annual Red Raider Classic. Doane went 3-1 with their only loss coming to conference foe, Dordt College in a non-conference, five-game match.

The Tigers put together another 3-1 weekend by participating in the College of St. Mary Classic. Doane lost their first match of the classic to No. 3 Concordia (CA) but came back that evening to defeat the host school in five games. Their third straight 3-1 weekend occurred at the Hastings Classic as the only loss came to No. 11 Bellevue, a match-up that would lay the foundation for a thrilling rematch at the national tournament.

The Tigers cruised through most of their conference games but dropped a match-up to Hastings at home in four games and five-game losses to Dordt and Morningside. Doane came back in mid-October to take a road contest at Hastings in four-games but dropped a five-game match at Northwestern that set-up a potential tie-breaker for fourth place and a GPAC First Round bye between the Tigers and Broncos. The race for the bye came down to the final day of the season, Doane needed to win in one less game played than Hastings to win the tie-breaker. The Tigers topped Dana in three games and then got help from Nebraska Wesleyan as they upset Hastings to give Doane fourth place outright. It would prove to be a key factor in the conference tournament.

Doane was still on the outside looking in as far as the national rankings went and they knew they needed at least one big win and then get some help. By far one of the most thrilling games at home in several years, the Tigers rallied in the Quarterfinals of the GPAC Tournament from a 2-0 deficit to Hastings and defeated the Broncos in five games, winning the match on an ace serve by NAIA All-American Chelsea Marvin. Doane lost to Northwestern in the semifinals and needed help from outside teams to make the national tournament. The Tigers had said their good byes as upsets were not falling in place but on the final day of conference tournament play, there were enough upsets that allowed the Tigers to move up in the polls and secure one of the final spots in the national tournament.

The Tigers hosted an Opening Round game and defeated Bethel College in four games in front of more than 1,000 fans. Doane went to Sioux City for pool play and found themselves in a rematch with Bellevue. The two teams played one of the best matches of the tournament with Bellevue winning in five. Doane defeated No. 11 Lindenwood in three but lost to Vanguard in the final match and the Tigers fell one victory short of advancing out of pool play.

Marvin was one of three senior leaders for the Tigers. Ashley Sluka earned All-GPAC honors while Amy Janky was named an NAIA Champions of Character recipient. Juniors Jessie Livers and Emily Schwisow earned All-GPAC honors in addition to freshman Terra Andreasen. Academics were also a strong point for the Tigers as Marvin, Sluka, Schwisow and junior Ivie Speer were all named NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

DOANE VOLLEYBALL HISTORY

Doane's volleyball history dates back to the early 1970s. According to newspaper reports, Doane's first year of women's athletics was 1972. Records and documents prior to 1987 are scarce, anyone with information that could help fill in this time gap please contact the Doane Sports Information Office.



In 1971, Doane volleyball was considered an intramural or club sport. It took a couple of years to build but Doane volleyball had reached national prominence by advancing to the NAIA National Tournament in 1985 while coached by Sandy Cottle.



Since then, Doane has been a consistent threat not only in the conference, but nationally as well. The program has averaged 26 wins per year and advanced to six NAIA National Tournaments, five times under current head coach Cindy Meyer.

During the past 24 years (1985-2008), eight women have earned



11 All-American team honors (first, second or third team). Lori Stueckrath (pictured left) earned All-American honors in 1987 and 1988, becoming the first Tiger to receive the award. Dayna Nyland and Andrea Gall also earned All-American honors in back-to-back years. Cindy Peterson joins Stueckrath with the honor of being the only Tigers to earn First Team All-American honors.

Doane has also had success in the classroom as 28 women have earned NAIA Scholar-Athlete honors. Nancy Sackett was the first to do so in 1985. In 2008, five women were honored, the most in school history.
