# ABOUT DOANE COLLEGE

When Thomas Doane, chief civil engineer of the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, began building the railroad across Nebraska in the late 1800s, his goal was not only to enhance civilized life for the pioneers, but also to build a liberal arts college on the Nebraska frontier. He and the Congregationalists soon chose the town of Crete, overlooking the Big Blue River, for a college on the plains. The college maintains historical ties with the United Church of Christ.

Thomas Doane's vision of a college in the tradition of Harvard and Yale has become a reality. Fully established in 1872, Doane is Nebraska's first private liberal arts and sciences college.

From the college's formative years under the tutelage of first president David Brainerd Perry to the current 11th president, Jonathan Brand, the college continues its purpose to educate students to serve and lead in the state, the nation and the world.

Today, the college serves more than 3,200 students in bachelor's and master's degree programs in Crete, Lincoln, and Grand Island, Neb., and focuses on providing an exceptional educational experience for all students.

Doane College is one of only two schools in Nebraska to be ranked among the top 25 institutions in the Midwest and as one of the Midwest's "best values" in the 2007 U.S. News & World Report College Guide.

The Crete campus serves approximately 1,000 residential students on 300 scenic acres. Designated a state arboretum, the once treeless landscape now boasts more than 100 varieties of trees, numerous plantings, ponds, and swans.

Doane College focuses on providing a student-centered, innovative environment for students and employees. Forty-plus major fields of study are offered, as well as pre-professional programs. More than 80 co-curricular activities and organizations are also available. From national championship athletic programs to music, theatre, and service clubs, students pursue many varied interests outside the classroom.



Leadership development underscores the students' experience in all aspects of the college. Doane's unique Hansen Leadership Program works with students to help enhance their leadership skills and talents, through speakers and events, alumni

mentors, course offerings, community service, and other activities.

Additional highlights include the four-year graduation guarantee for students...graduate within four years or the college will pay for a fifth year of course work. A travel scholarship for students provides opportunities to travel on college-sponsored trips in the U.S. or abroad. Doane College was the first institution in the nation to initiate a warranty for its education graduates to hiring school districts, and guarantees teacher education graduates a position.

Doane College also offers three graduate degree programs, including the Master of Arts in Management (MAM), Master of Arts in Counseling (MAC), and Master of Education (MED) in Curriculum and Instruction or Educational Leadership.

## ACADEMIC SUPPORT CENTER

The transition from high school to college level academics is a dramatic one, but it need not be traumatic if students make use of the resources Doane College provides through the Academic Support Center (ASC).



In contrast to many students' high school course experiences, most college level courses demand a whole new study and exam preparation strategy. Most college professors fully expect that students will complete the assigned textbook readings and come to class prepared to ask questions and engage in discussion generated by the reading assignment. Professors' lectures complement and supplement the required reading assignment, but they are not intended to substitute for required readings.

Likewise, students must attend lectures and labs if they are to gain the full benefit of their educational opportunity. Completing the assigned readings, attending lectures and labs, being able to record accurate reading/lecture notes and reviewing their notes regularly in preparation for exams and finals are all critical to any student's academic success.

Doane's Academic Support Center (ASC) provides academic assistance, training and intervention to students who wish to improve their academic performance. The ASC consists of two separate programs: The Doane Learning Center (DLC) and Doane Student Support Services (DSS). Both programs are housed in the Student Services area on the lower level of Perry Campus Center.

The Doane Learning Center is a walk-in center for students wanting to raise their grades or improve their study skills. The program provides academic counseling, peer tutoring, and writing assistance.

Doane Student Support Services (DSS) is a TRIO program, federally funded through the United States Department of Education. It assists eligible students in reaching their academic and personal goals through a variety of activities. Notification of eligibility is sent to new students in the first few weeks of the fall and spring terms and is dependent on American citizenship AND family income level, (or) student disability status or both custodial parents/guardians having less than a four-year degree.



## DOANE FACILITIES

The Doane College athletic facilities continue to change and improve each year.

**Simon Field** was constructed in 1929 following a generous gift from G. Eli Simon, a Cambridge, Nebraska, attorney and father of a graduating senior. Simon Field is located on the north side of the campus and is home to the football and soccer teams. Lauritsen Track surrounds the field and is home to the track & field teams.

Field turf was installed in 2000. As part of the renovation, a new outdoor, polyurethane track was also installed. Both the field and track are used by the Crete community and Crete High School. The press box was wired with Internet capabilities in the summer of 2004.



Located on the eastern end of campus, **The Den** is the alternate home to Doane soccer. The first home of Doane Soccer, The Den is a grass surface used mostly for practices.

Located on the northeast end of the Doane campus, **Fuhrer Field House** is home to Tiger volleyball, men's & women's basketball, and indoor track & field. The Field House is also used for early season practices for baseball, softball, and tennis. Fuhrer Field House underwent a major renovation starting in the winter of 2001. Changes of note are new bleachers that allow for 1,900 fans, including portable bleachers that sit in the end zones of the court to bring the fans closer, a movement of the court floor closer to the main bleachers, a new mondo track surface, new lights, wiring, and speakers, and wall pictures hung to display each Tiger sport. The renovation of the athletic training room is the most recent improvement to the facility.

The **Jose M. & Elizabeth Ledon Softball and Baseball Complex** opened in March 2007. The complex is located on the east end of campus and is home to Tiger baseball and softball. The facility includes batting cages, a two-story press box and concession stand.

## Athletic Director



**Greg Heier** took over as Athletic Director in May 2006. Heier played four years at Doane on the men's basketball team guided by NAIA Hall-of-Fame coach Bob Erickson beginning with the 1981-82 season and ending with the 1984-85 season. Heier earned his B.S. degree in Political Science in 1985 and a J.D. degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1988. Heier also served as an assistant basketball coach for the Tigers from 1998-2002. During that time, Heier helped coach the last men's basketball team to have won a post-season conference championship and earn a spot in the NAIA Division II National Championship Tournament. Prior to serving as Athletic Director, Heier practiced law from 1988 until 1998 and worked in human resources and risk management for Doane from 1998 until 2006. He has been a life long fan of Doane Tiger Athletics!

## Athletic Trainers



**Stefanie Kindt** became the Tigers' Head Athletic Trainer in 1997. She is a 1991 graduate of North Dakota State University, Fargo, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training. She has a Master's degree from the University of Florida, Gainesville, in Exercise and Sports Sciences. Kindt is a Certified Athletic Trainer through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and a Certified Strength and

Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). She is also an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.



**Brad Jenny** joined the Tiger athletic training staff in 1999 as assistant Athletic Trainer. He is a 1993 graduate of Doane College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with an Athletic Training emphasis. He has a Master's degree in HPER (health, physical education and recreation) from Northern State University in Aberdeen, S.D., where he served as a graduate assistant Athletic Trainer for one year. Brad is

certified through the National Athletic Trainers' Association and also holds a CSCS through the NSCA.

## DOANE MEDIA INFORMATION



The Doane College Sports Information Office is always interested in helping members of the media in their coverage of Tiger Athletics. Athlete features and interviews, credential request, photographs and statistics are available through the sports information office.

Rick Schmuecker joined the Tiger team in August 2001 as Assistant Sports Information Director, following four years as a student at Midland Lutheran College. In May 2006, he was named head of the Sports Information Department by Athletic Director Greg Heier.

At Doane, Rick is seen at all home athletic events, usually in the designated media areas, either keep stats, broadcasting or both. He has received publication honors by the NAIA-SIDA in football and soccer as well as with the Doane athletic Web site. In June 2008, he received 2nd Place honors for the women's soccer media guide, the highest honor received by himself or Doane through the NAIA-SIDA contests. ## ABOUT THE GPAC

The Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) is an affiliated conference of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), consisting of 13 private, faith-based colleges and universities in Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota.



Originally founded in 1969 as the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NIAC), the league retains all six of its charter members - Concordia, Dana, Doane, Hastings, Midland Lutheran and Nebraska Wesleyan. In 1992, the NIAC added Northwestern and became the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference. Eight years later, Dakota Wesleyan, Dordt, Mount Marty and Sioux Falls joined the conference which became the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) in 2000-2001. Briar Cliff entered the league in 2002-2003 and Morningside became the 13th member a year later. Both schools are in Sioux City, Iowa.

Beginning with the 2005-2006 school year, the GPAC started awarding the Christopherson All-Academic Award. The award is a traveling trophy to be presented annually to the GPAC institution with the best academic performance by its student-athletes in all sports. The GPAC has also boasted more than 400 scholar-athletes each of the last two years.

### **The GPAC has 15 NAIA National Champions...**

In 2000-2001 the Northwestern women and men won NAIA Division II National Basketball Championships, while the Doane women shared the outdoor NAIA Track and Field title. 2001-2002 brought two NAIA titles to our league. The Hastings women won the NAIA Division II National Basketball title, while Doane's women won the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championship outright. In 2002-2003 the GPAC won two more National Championships with the Hastings women repeating as NAIA Division II National Basketball Champions, and the Northwestern men winning the NAIA Division II crown for the second time in three years. The Morningside women's basketball teams won the 2004 and 2005 titles in front of the hometown Sioux City fans at the Tyson Events Center. In 2006 the Hastings women's basketball team won their third basketball title in five years. The GPAC won six straight NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championships from 2001 to 2006. Also, in 2006 Dana College claimed the NAIA National Wrestling Championship, while the Nebraska Wesleyan's men's golf team won the NCAA III National Title. In the fall of 2006 when Sioux Falls won the Football National Championship in Savannah, Tennessee. The Northwestern women's basketball team capped a 35-2 season in winning the 2008 NAIA Division II National Championship. The University of Sioux Falls won their second NAIA Football Title in three years by claiming the 2008 National Championship in Rome, Georgia, on December 20. In March of 2009 the Morningside Women's Basketball team capped a perfect 38-0 season by claiming the NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Championship. The title game was an All-GPAC matchup as Hastings claimed Runner-Up honors. The GPAC has now won eight of the last nine NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Championships!

## **2009 PRESEASON OUTLOOK**

The 2009 Tigers will feature a good blend of experience and youth as 11 players return and 11 new players come in to Doane. Coming off an 11-7-1 record and fourth place finish in the GPAC, along with the conference's leading scorer back on the field, expectations are high for the Tigers and first-year coach Greg Jarosik. Jarosik took over the women's program in June and will also continue to serve as the men's coach.

Samantha Exstrom returns after scoring 22 goals last season to lead the conference while also marking her second year with 20 or more goals. Sarah Medina was second in goals and first in assists last year as a freshman and returns as well. The two of them, joined Beth Weiner, Terianne Colangelo and a couple of newcomers, could provide some offensive excitement this season.

The midfield will be strong as the Tigers return starters Jordan Hedgecock, Clare Koeppe and Jayne Wagner in addition to Medina. Emma Kucera also provides experience at the position.

The defense is anchored by Kelsey Bryant and Kayleen Stanek, both all-conference honorees a year ago.

In goal is four-year starter Alicia Exstrom. Exstrom has moved her way into the Top 5 of several goalkeeping categories.

Newcomers in every position will push the returning players as this is being touted as possibly one of the best recruit classes. Arguments can be made for the 2007 class which features several juniors who are currently starting for the team.

The schedule will be tough. After the season opener at home against Jamestown College, the Tigers will play Concordia University (CA) and Vanguard in California before making a trip to William Jewell.

The conference slate will open with back-to-back home games against Midland Lutheran and Dordt.

## **2008 SEASON RECAP**

The Tigers showed improvement for the second straight year, finishing with an 11-7-1 record overall and 7-4-1 mark in the GPAC. Doane qualified for the conference post-season for the first time in five years.

The Tigers opened the season on the west coast, dropping the season opener to Evergreen State, 3-2. They bounced back with a 2-0 shutout victory over Warner Pacific College.

The home opener was against No. 14 William Jewell College and the Tigers fell 3-1 to the Cardinals. A trip to Ottawa, Kansas, brought two wins for Doane as they defeated Avila (2-0) and Ottawa (1-0). In the final non-conference game of the year, the Tigers topped Tabor College 4-0 as Samantha Exstrom picked up two of the goals.

Conference play did not start off well for the Tigers as they dropped back-to-back games against Midland Lutheran and Dordt by a combined score of 6-1.

Upon returning home, the Tigers picked up a pair of wins over Concordia and Briar Cliff. Exstrom scored both goals against the Bulldogs and one of the goals against the Chargers.

Back-to-back double overtime games came to Doane next. The Tigers tied Dana, 1-1, and won late against Morningside, 4-3, on an Exstrom goal. Doane followed with a shutout win over Sioux Falls, 4-0, and a win over Nebraska Wesleyan, 4-2. Exstrom scored all four goals against the Prairie Wolves and it also marked the second time in which Doane had beaten NWU.

The Tigers lost their next two games, both on the road. All GPAC losses for the Tigers came away from home. Dakota Wesleyan shut out the Tigers while Hastings won by two goals. Doane ended the regular season with wins over Mount Marty and Northwestern.

The GPAC Tournament opened in Crete with the Tigers hosting Morningside. The first time around was a thriller and this one looked like the Tigers were going to run away after jumping ahead 3-0. However, Doane may have started to look ahead too early as the Mustangs raced to four unanswered goals and ended the Tiger season, 4-3.

Five players earned all-conference honors. Samantha Exstrom led the GPAC with 22 goals and was named First Team All-GPAC. Kelsey Bryant, Kayleen Stanek, Jordan Hedgecock and Sarah Medina each collected honorable mention honors.

The Tigers also had four players excel in the classroom. Senior Kelly Spencer earned NAIA Scholar-Athlete honors for the second time while Jaime Duggan, Bridget Koehler and Kelsey Kovar were named for the first time to the list.

## DOANE SOCCER HISTORY

Doane women's soccer began as an intercollegiate sport in the fall of 1996. The Tigers went 7-7 in that first year under coach Eliot Siegman. Siegman went on to coach Doane for eight of the first nine years and was named the Nebraska-Iowa Athletic Conference (NIAC) Coach-of-the-Year in 1997 when they posted a school-best record 13-6-1. In 2008, the Tigers qualified for the NAIA Region III tournament for the first time. The NAIA dropped regional tournaments the following year.



Doane is one of a few schools that has two playing surfaces. The Den is a natural grass surface located on the east end of campus while Simon Field (pictured above) is an artificial turf surface that is also used for football and located on the north end of campus.

The Tigers have also had some excellent players come through the ranks during the brief existence. Jeni Swanson was the first Tiger to earn conference player-of-the-year honors after she posted 29 goals and 12 assists in 1999. Stacy Vendetti followed Swanson's honor a year later in 2000, the first year of the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC), by posting 20 goals. Amanda Creighton earned the conference honor in 2002 as she posted 21 goals and nine assists on her way to becoming a Second Team NAIA All-American.



One of the most underrated Tigers was goalkeeper Shannon Sullivan. Sullivan was a four-year starter and graduated with nine of 11 school records. She earned honorable mention All-American honors in her final season (2004) while

posting nine shutouts and 13 wins. She is the all-time wins leader with 37, saves leader with 652, and is second in goals against average with 2.27 per game.
